\*2080 **HEALTH—EATING DISORDERS**—Mr Secord asked the Minister for Primary Industries, Minister for Regional Water, Minister for Trade and Industry representing the Minister for Health, and Minister for Medical Research—

- (1) As of 28 February 2018, how many adult overnight hospital beds are there for the treatment of eating disorders such as anorexia nervosa in New South Wales?
  - (a) Where are those beds located by hospital?
- (2) As of 28 February 2018, how many adult day hospital beds are there for the treatment of eating disorders such as anorexia nervosa in New South Wales?
  - (a) Where are those beds located by hospital?
- (3) As of 28 February 2018, how many overnight hospital beds for patients under the age of 18 are there for the treatment of eating disorders such as anorexia nervosa in New South Wales?
  - (a) Where are those beds located by hospital?
- (4) As of 28 February 2018, how many day hospital beds for patients under the age of 18 are there for the treatment of eating disorders such as anorexia nervosa in New South Wales?
  - (a) Where are those beds located by hospital?

Answer—

- (1) to (4) This is a matter that should have been address to the Minister for Mental Health, but I advise that NSW Labor (under Minister Refshauge) announced that it would be addressing the needs of patients with anorexia nervosa. In reality almost nothing occurred.  
The Government are now addressing the backlog of services incurred under Labor.

\*2081 **EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION—OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE SERVICES**—Mrs Houssos asked the Minister for Early Childhood Education, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, Assistant Minister for Education—

- (1) What consultation was undertaken prior to the announcement that the pre-qualification scheme for out of school hours care services would be abandoned?
  - (a) Specifically who was consulted with, prior to the decision?
- (2) Who conducted the internal review to remove the pre-qualification scheme for out of school hours care services?
- (3) Why is the Government allowing blacklisted operator Camp Australia to purchase child care operations in New South Wales when they were previously banned in November 2016?

Answer—

- (1) The pre-qualification scheme was put to the market for comment.
- (2) The Department of Education's Asset Management Directorate carried out the review in consultation with Early Childhood Education Directorate and its legal representatives.
- (3) The department has come up with an interim process for assessing tenders to ensure selected organisations are able to provide a quality service. The department is currently adapting its tender processes to formalise this quality assessment.

\*2082 **ROADS, MARITIME AND FREIGHT—M5 MOTORWAY SLOW TRAFFIC WARNING SIGNS**—Mrs Houssos asked the Minister for Primary Industries, Minister for Regional Water, Minister for Trade and Industry representing the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

- (1) What is the process to end the slow traffic warnings on the electronic signs approaching the M5 motorway?
- (2) What monitoring process is there of the traffic when these slow traffic warning signs are in operation on the M5 motorway?

- (3) Is there any monitoring or coordination with the traffic timing signs, ie, the signs indicating the amount of time to a destination, on the M5 motorway?
- (4) What is the coordination between the reduced speed limit signs and the slow traffic warning signs?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Motorway Control Centre monitors traffic using CCTV and traffic data obtained from loops in the road pavement to detect a reduction in traffic speed and the commencement of queuing. Once queuing reaches a specified length, a preprogramed traffic management plan is activated which will reduce the speed limit and activate slow traffic warnings. Slow traffic warnings cease being displayed when the queue length reduces.
