*255 ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENT—COAL SEAM GAS EXPLORATION AND APPRAISAL—Ms Boyd asked the Minister for Mental Health, Regional Youth and Women representing the Minister for Energy and Environment—

Referring to coal seam gas exploration and appraisal that has been underway on Petroleum Assessment Lease 2 (PAL 2) and Petroleum Exploration Lease 238 (PEL238) since 2004:

- (1) How does the government determine what is genuine appraisal activity in general?
- (2) How has the government determined what is genuine appraisal activity in the cases of PAL2 and PEL238?
- (3) How much gas has been piped to Wilga Park power station from PAL2 in the 2018/19 financial year?
- (4) How much gas has been piped to Wilga Park power station from PEL238 in financial years:
 - (a) 2014/15?
 - (b) 2015/16?
 - (c) 2016/17?
 - (d) 2017/18?
 - (e) 2018/19?
- (5) If full year data is unavailable for 2018/19, what is the latest recorded data and date recorded to?
- (6) How much of the gas from PAL2 and PEL238 has been subject to royalty payment?
- (7) How much has been paid in royalty on that gas?

Answer—

These questions should be referred to the Deputy Premier, and Minister for Regional New South Wales, Industry and Trade.

I am advised that:

In response to questions 1 and 2, under a Petroleum Exploration Licence (PEL) and Petroleum Assessment Lease (PAL) titleholders must operate their licences in accordance with an activity approval for assessable prospecting activities.

As part of the approved activities for PAL2 and PEL238, gas is generated from wells covered by these titles as part of the titleholder's exploration program.

In general, during appraisal activities, a titleholder may collect information on average well production rates and gas composition analyses.

In response to questions 3, 4 and 5, I am advised that the Petroleum (Onshore) Regulation 2016 limits the beneficial use of gas extracted by number of days rather than volume. The Department does not hold data on the amount of gas that is sent to Wilga Park power station for beneficial use.

In response to questions 6 and 7, under the NSW royalty regime, royalties are payable on the net well head value of gas. The net well head value is calculated by subtracting allowable deductions (certain operating expenses from the gross value of the gas produced). However, the allowable deductions are currently greater than the revenue, resulting in a negative net value.

Answer-

Exposure to smoke from wood burning heaters may have adverse health effects, ranging from itchy eyes to exacerbation of existing health conditions.
