***5091 REGIONAL TRANSPORT AND ROADS—GROUND LEVEL ROAD SAFETY BARRIERS—**Ms Hurst asked the Leader of the Government in the Legislative Council, Special Minister of State, Minister for the Public Service and Employee Relations, Aboriginal Affairs, and the Arts, Vice-President of the Executive Council representing the Minister for Regional Transport and Roads—

On some rural roads in addition to the steel W-beam road safety barrier there is an additional metal barrier resting on the ground at an angle.

- (1) What is the purpose of the additional ground level barrier?
- (2) Are the additional barriers necessary for road safety?
- (3) Have any assessments been done to assess the risks to wildlife of these barriers?

Answer—

I am advised:

- (1) Due to the safety benefits, Transport for NSW (TfNSW) supports the installation of motorcycle underrun at road sections and/or routes that pose the highest crash risk to motorcyclists. Motorcycle underrun is most commonly installed on curves with a nonstandard curve radius. Additionally, motorcycle underrun is appropriate on roads carrying significant volumes of motorcyclists and at locations with known motorcycle single vehicle off-road crashes.
- (2) The installation of additional ground level barriers are necessary for improving road safety on the road network. Research by TfNSW found the inclusion of motorcycle underrun as an addition to roadside barriers will result in a 20 per cent reduction in the severity of a single vehicle off-carriageway motorcycle crash. Safety barriers are a popular and proven countermeasure used to protect vehicle occupants from roadside hazards.
- (3) No formal wildlife assessments have been made for the following safety barriers:
 - Biker-shield motorcyclist rub rail
 - HIASA motorcyclist protection device
 - INGAL motorcyclist protection rail
 - NSW motorcyclist protection system;

The INGAL fencing is expected to be permeable to most native wildlife, while the HIASA and NSW Motorist Protection System are expected to be permeable to smaller species. The biker-shield fencing is likely to only allow animals capable of jumping the fence to enter and exit the road corridor. The appropriateness of each type of fence in any particular circumstance is determined on a case-by-case basis.

- (1) On what date were affected residents advised of plans to acquire nine residential properties for future use as a commuter carpark?
- (2) On what date was Sutherland Shire Council advised of plans to acquire nine residential properties for future use as a commuter carpark?
- (3) Is it usual practice to issue notices of compulsory acquisition during the "early planning" stage?
- (4) Were other options considered other than compulsory acquisition?
 - (a) If yes, please list the other options considered?
- (5) Does the proposed carpark meet the Department of Transport's State outcome of building "successful places for communities"?
 - (a) If yes, please provide details of how that is measured.
- (6) On what basis was the proposed site bounding Mary St, Victoria St and Mitchell Ave Jannali,

featuring the nine residential properties, selected?

Answer—

I am advised:

The NSW Government is committed to doing all that it can to encourage the community to leave their cars at home and, where possible, use public transport to ease congestion across Greater Sydney. Providing extra car spaces at key commuter hubs, stations and interchanges is one of the critical strategies to delivering this mode shift. It recognises that some members of the community need to drive to their local station before jumping on public transport, which is why more than 10,000 parking spaces have been delivered across the network since 2011, with another 8,000 spaces on the way, including at Jannali Station. More information about commuter car parks program is available at www.transport.nsw.gov.au and www.transportnsw.info.

In February 2019, the NSW Government committed to delivering up to 200 additional commuter parking spaces at Jannali Station. Several options for the parking were investigated in conjunction with Sutherland Shire Council. The Box Lane council car park site was the preferred option. Disappointingly, for over two years Sutherland Shire Council refused to finalise a clear pathway forward or commit to the timely delivery of this local infrastructure. The Sutherland Shire Council's failure to resolve this matter in a timely fashion meant that the NSW Government was left with no option but to find an alternate site to deliver this important local infrastructure. Regrettably, this impacted people's lives.

I am advised that Sutherland Shire Council has now finally committed to commencing the rezoning of the Box Lane car park so that up to 200 additional car spaces, together with retail and other community facilities, can be delivered as an integrated solution for the community.

In light of the above, you may be interested to know that I have directed Transport for NSW to:

- (1) Fund Sutherland Shire Council to deliver up to 200 additional commuter car spaces as part of the redevelopment of the existing Box Lane car park by the end of 2024;
- (2) Terminate the acquisition of homes on Mitchell Avenue and Mary Street; and
- (3) Take steps to actively monitor Sutherland Shire Council's progress of the delivery of the additional car spaces at the Box Lane site, including to potentially step in and deliver the project if Sutherland Shire Council once again delays delivery.

You may be interested to know that the NSW Government has allocated additional funding towards this project from our \$3 billion Infrastructure and Job Acceleration Fund. This fund, established in response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, is intended to be used for smaller, shovel-ready projects, injecting up to 20,000 jobs into the NSW workforce.
