\*4979 EDUCATION AND EARLY CHILDHOOD LEARNING—ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER RETENTION RATES—Mrs Houssos asked the Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning—

  - (b) 2019?
  - (c) 2020?

Answer—

Apparent retention rates are a reliable measure for large cohorts of students (at least 150) but they can be very volatile and misleading for small cohorts such as this. Students may have left Great Lakes College but still be enrolled in Year 10 or Year 12 at a different government or non-government school. The apparent retention rate calculated below is based on Aboriginal student enrolments on the first Friday in August in a given year.

- (1) The Year 7 to Year 10, Year 11 to Year 12 and Year 7 to Year 12 apparent retention rate of Aboriginal students for the period 2018 to 2020 at the Great Lakes College:

\*4980 AGRICULTURE AND WESTERN NEW SOUTH WALES—LIONESS AND CUB DEATHS—Ms Hurst asked the Minister for Mental Health, Regional Youth and Women representing the Minister for Agriculture and Western New South Wales—

On 8 December 2020 at Mogo Wildlife Park, a lioness Zuri gave birth to three lion cubs. One cub died on 8 December 2020, Zuri the lioness died three days later, the second cub died four weeks later and the third cub according to media reports is living at a Sydney home with a zoo keeper, his partner and four children under 12:

Can the Minister please advise:

- (1) Was a suitably qualified vet who has experience with lions in attendance at the birth?
- (2) What was the cause of death of the lioness?
- (3) What was the cause of death of the cub that died on 8 December 2020?
- (4) Has any investigation been conducted into the death of the second cub?
  - (a) Was the second cub staying at a family home in Sydney when it died?
  - (b) Was the cub treated by a suitably qualified vet with experience with lions?
  - (c) What was the cause of the second cub's death?
- (5) Is it legal to keep a lion cub in a family home in Sydney?
  - (a) If not, have any proceeding been brought against Mogo Wildlife Park?
  - (b) If not, where is the third lion cub currently living?

Answer—

- (1) Yes
- (2) Euthanasia, due to toxemia from uterine tear and dystocia.
- (3) No lion cub deaths occurred on 8 December 2020. Cub #1 and #2 were born on 12 December 2020. Cub #3 and #4 were stillborn 14 December 2020.
- (4) Yes, a post-mortem was undertaken by the authority holder on Cub #1 that died on 13 January 2021. The reason for death was determined to be from natural causes.
  - (a) No, cub #1 died while being hand raised on the licensed premises at Mogo Zoo.
  - (b) Yes.

Answer—

- (1) In developing the NSW Pumped Hydro Roadmap, the NSW Government worked with the ANU to uncover pumped hydro opportunities for the private sector to investigate across the State. ANU's mapping was used to demonstrate potential at a regional level, rather than identify specific sites, including WaterNSW dam assets, for development. b. WaterNSW, under its Renewable Energy and Storage Program, has considered 38 WaterNSW dam and land assets which could be utilised for private investment to develop pumped hydro schemes.
- (2) As stated in 1 above, WaterNSW considered 38 of its dam and land assets for potential development, noting that it was up to the proponents interested in participating in the WaterNSW Renewable Energy and Storage Program to determine the suitability and opportunity posed by each WaterNSW site. Those proponents that were shortlisted under Stage 1 of the Program (i.e invited to submit a formal proposal under a Request for Proposal procurement process), conducted their own desk top study and in some cases were afforded access to site visits when requested.
- (3) This is primarily a matter for the Minister for Energy and Environment. However, with respect to WaterNSW's Renewable Energy and Storage Program, please refer to answers to questions 4 and 5 below.
- (4) Under the Renewable Energy and Storage Program EOI (Expression of Interest), WaterNSW received 65 submissions for schemes across its dam and land assets. Due to the number, WaterNSW ranked these schemes and invited formal submissions (from seven proponents) for the top 22 schemes (across 12 dam sites). Of the 65 submissions received under the EOI, 29 were identified as being pumped hydro and 3 identified as floating solar. The remainder were a collection of hydro, mini hydro, wind, solar (land based), weir or flow shaping and or duplication of existing hydro schemes.
- (5) Of the 22 schemes invited to submit, only two schemes by one proponent are being considered after proponents for the other schemes decided to withdraw due to financial (cost of submissions including development securities), business (focus on current core business matters), or other issues. For those two schemes participating in the WaterNSW Renewable Energy and Storage Program, Stage 1:
  - (a) there were two Pre-investment studies for the schemes, one at Glenbawn Dam and one at Glennies Creek Dam by the proponent.
  - (b) WaterNSW is not aware of any investment announcements.
  - (c) there have been Development Applications and a preliminary application to the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment by the proponent for its schemes at Glenbawn Dam and Glennies Creek Dam.
  - (d) there are no Development approvals to date.
  - (e) there has been no construction since December 2018.
