Initiation of proceedings for an ADVO or APVO against a police officer is subject to an assessment as a complaint under the Police Act 1990 under the NSW Police Force Misconduct Management Framework, as it is defined as misconduct information in accordance with the *Law Enforcement Conduct Commission Act 2016*. The NSW Police Force Professional Standards Command oversights misconduct matters.

NSW Police Force policies and procedures outline how serving police officers are investigated and charged following the initiation of ADVO and APVO proceedings. Under these existing policies, where a police officer is a defendant in ADVO proceedings their NSW Police Force firearm is immediately secured to prevent access. Commands conduct ongoing risk assessments throughout the ADVO and APVO process in relation to a Defendant officer's access to arms and appointments.

Furthermore, where an officer of the NSW Police Force holds a personal firearms licence the officer is subject to the operation the *Firearms Act 1996*.
