Answer—

The Royalties for Rejuvenation Fund has been established as a future fund to invest in the long-term prosperity of coal mining communities. A statutory Expert Panel will be appointed to oversee the Fund.

The panel will comprise of community, council and industry representatives from coal mining communities. These communities and their leaders are best placed to plan for their future and the Panel will have a central role in planning for the Fund's investment.

- * 6538 EDUCATION AND EARLY CHILDHOOD LEARNING—POSITIVE SEXUAL CONSENT LAW REFORM PACKAGE—The Hon. Mark Latham to ask the Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning—
 - (1) The Minister announced on 25 May 2021 in tandem with the Attorney General the Government's 'positive sexual consent' law reform package.

Answer—

(1)(a)

(i) As a result of the recently announced legislative reforms and the cross-sectoral Statement of Intent, the Department of Education is reviewing its respectful relationships teaching and learning resources, including those that support the

teaching of consent in an age-appropriate way from Kindergarten to Year 1O in Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE). To support teaching of respectful relationships, a new range of curriculum-aligned teaching and learning resources - PDHPE curriculum - will also be created for teachers and made available next term.

- (ii) The Statement of Intent also includes a commitment to ensuring that respectful relationships and consent education in the NSW Curriculum remains "current, robust, based on best-practice principles, supported by quality resources, and delivered in ways that meet the needs of all children and young people in their communities." Any changes to consent education in the NSW Curriculum following legislative change will be developed through NSW's Curriculum Reform, which is currently underway.
- (2) The cross-sectoral Statement of Intent recognised that building healthy and respectful relationships is everyone's responsibility and schools, in partnership with parents and the broader community, have a vital role and specific responsibility.

As part of the commitment, we are engaging with parent representative associations regarding the development and implementation of strategies to strengthen children and young people's understanding of consent. This engagement is underway and will inform the development of any future resources that might be made available for parents and carers.
