I am advised that a student at Lucas Heights Community put up one poster relating to the Twenty 10 organisation in the high school area of the school. This was done without the knowledge of school staff, and the poster has since been removed.

The choice of material used in this instance in a Year 8 Visual Arts lesson in 2020 was not appropriate. The teacher was appropriately cautioned.

The matter was discussed with concerned parents.

No student received a negative referral in relation to this matter.

We have a policy in place which guides controversial issues in schools. It remains my expectation and the department's that teachers adhere to this policy, use their common sense, and use appropriate resources in the classroom, which the vast majority of teachers do every day.
