2873 SCHOFIELDS RAILWAY STATION - CAR PARKING

MR KEVIN CONOLLY to move—

That this House:

- (1) Welcomes the commencement of construction of the western commuter car park at Schofields Railway Station which is funded by the allocation of \$13.7 million in the 2021-22 Budget.
