- (1) (a)(i-ii) In June 2021, Transport for NSW appointed JLL for a fee of \$65,400 (excl. GST), to provide branding, advertising and project management services for a Tech Central Expression of Interest Campaign for technology-related businesses interested in occupying space on levels 1-3 of the existing Sydney Terminal Building, which became known as the Quantum Terminal.
 - The initial Expression of Interest, run by JLL in June 2021, remains open for parties interested in leasing desks at the Quantum Terminal.
- (1) (b)(i-ii) Transport Asset Holding Entity has an existing contract with JLL to manage commercial facilities. JLL, through their subsidiary company JLL Flex, manages the operation of the Quantum Terminal for a base fee of \$8,333 per month.
 - The contract is nominally expected to conclude in May 2023, however it includes provisions for extension of time, if required.
- (1) (b)(iii) No.
- (1) There is no required occupancy rate.
- (2) There is no required occupancy rate due to a range of factors, including the short-term of the contract, lack of precedent for and uncertainty of the market including return to offices in a post-COVID environment.
- 2(c) From November 2021 to 30 June 2022, the budgeted operating costs are approximately \$738,000. However, for the 2022 financial year, the current forecast for actual operating costs is approximately \$550,000. For the 2023 financial year, the draft budget operating costs are \$1.1 million, with a modest surplus of funds forecast.

 - (i-iv) The Government committed to deliver up to 25,000 square metres of affordable space for start-ups and scale-ups over the next five years around Central Station. The Quantum Terminal is part of that space commitment.
 - The Quantum Terminal makes use of an underused government asset, the upper levels of the Sydney Terminal Building, to provide affordable space for technology companies in Tech Central and has been established quickly to support start-ups in the Quantum Computing, Artificial Intelligence and High-Performance Computing sectors.
