- * 9570 EMERGENCY SERVICES AND RESILIENCE—VACANT POSITIONS IN RFS—The Hon. Mark Buttigieg to ask the Minister for Regional Transport and Roads representing the Minister for Emergency Services and Resilience, and Minister for Flood Recovery—
 - (1) How many full-time equivalent positions currently exist in the Rural Fire Service?
 - (2) How many full-time equivalent positions are currently vacant in the Rural Fire Service?
 - (a) At what location does each current vacancy exist?
 - (b) What is the position title of each currently vacant full-time equivalent position in the Rural Fire Service?
 - (c) Can the data regarding the number of currently vacant full-time equivalent positions in the Rural Fire Service also be presented in an organisational chart?

- (a-c) Due to the NSW Rural Fire Service's flexible and dynamic nature of resourcing and staffing deployment, many staff work across districts and zones.

As part of the 2022-23 NSW Budget, the NSW Government announced \$75.4 million for permanent RFS mitigation crews, as part of a \$315.2 million commitment to complete recommendations from the NSW Bushfire Inquiry.

To facilitate that, the RFS is currently undertaking a significant recruitment drive of more than 140 mitigation crew leaders and members.

During periods of heightened bush fire risk and activity, the RFS can draw upon its volunteer and staff base of more than 70,000, to ensure continuity of front line operations. This can include secondments from other districts to meet any need. Any vacancies are publicly advertised at https://iworkfolnsw.gov.au.

- * 9571 EDUCATION AND EARLY LEARNING—STANDARDS OF NSW TEACHERS—The Hon. Mark Latham to ask the Minister for Education and Early Learning—
 - (1) What progress has the Government made with the implementation of the 2018 announcement by Minister Stokes, the Minister for Education at the time, that only university graduates with a 70-plus Grade Point Average could teach in New South Wales schools?
 - (a) Have exceptions been made to this policy?
 - (i) If so, how many exceptions have been made?

Answer-

The Teacher Success Profile (TSP) sets the benchmark that university graduates must meet to be eligible for employment in NSW public schools. The policy required graduates entering initial teacher education from 2019 to attain a minimum credit grade point average by completion of their studies, as a condition of eligibility for permanent employment in NSW public schools.

Initial teacher education students who enrolled in their course from January 2019 and are completing a Bachelor of Education in 2022 are the first exiting cohort to which the credit average requirement comes into place.

- 9664 EDUCATION AND EARLY LEARNING—LANTITE TEST—The Hon. Mark Latham to ask the Minister for Education and Early Learning—
 - (1) Referring to the Government's commitment to attract highly skilled industry professionals into teaching positions:
 - (a) Why are mature-age teaching graduates who already have Masters and PhD specialisations still required to sit (and pay for) the LANTITE test, despite demonstrating a clear capacity to produce peer-reviewed theses as part of their qualifications?
 - (b) What rationale and justification does the Government provide that requires these industry experts to sit for this test to assess their basic writing and numeracy skills?
 - (c) Will the Government commit to eliminating this costly and unnecessarily hindering red tape to facilitate the transition of these highly lucrative and valuable industry experts into teaching?
