- * 0672 POLICE AND COUNTER-TERRORISM—USE OF POLICE DOGS TO APPREHEND SUSPECTS— The Hon. Aileen MacDonald to ask the Minister for Agriculture, Minister for Regional New South Wales, and Minister for Western New South Wales representing the Minister for Police and Counter-terrorism—
 - (1) Recently in the media it was reported that a police unit canine was used to apprehend a 16 year old wanted for questioning in the Mid Coast area, the dog latched onto the 16 year old bringing him to the ground and it appeared that the young person was in pain:
 - (a) Can the Minister advise at what point should the dog's handler intervene to ensure no further injury or pain is administered?
 - (2) Noting the three main functions of the Police Dog Unit are drug detection, firearm and explosives detection and tracking missing persons:
 - (a) Could the Minister please advise what other uses the dog unit has in police work?
 - (3) Could the Minister please advise what the normal procedure is when using the dog units to apprehend witnesses and suspects?

- (2)(a) The NSW Police Force utilises:
 - General Purpose (GP) Dogs for tracking and searching of people, specifically trained in Public Order and Specialist Tactical deployments;
 - Blood Detection Dog and Urban Search and Rescue for assistance in supporting emergency situations, such as searching for and locating live human beings following large scale structural collapse; and
 - Cadaver Detection Dogs.
- (3) Only GP dogs are used to apprehend a person believed to have committed a criminal offence. GP dogs are not used to apprehend witnesses. The use of a GP dog to apprehend suspects is subject to the provisions of Part 18 of the *Law Enforcement (Powers and Responsibilities) Act 2022*.

Planned rail and bus transport services for the five games to be played at Stadium Australia, Sydney Olympic Park:

- Trains: additional services will operate including express and limited stop trains between Central
 and Olympic Park stations, and western line stations and Olympic Park. There will also be a buildup of carriages on various rail lines.
- Buses: Sydney Olympic Park major event buses will run for all five games at Olympic Park across all nine major event bus routes.
- All other transport modes will be operating on regular timetables.

The Rail Repair Plan works will not impact the rail transport arrangements for the event.

Planned light rail and bus transport services for the six games to be played at Sydney Football Stadium, Moore Park:

- Light rail: additional frequent L2/L3 light rail services will run between Central and Moore Park, before and after each match.
- Shuttle buses: a limited number of dedicated express shuttle buses will run between Central Station and Moore Park bus terminal for each match.
