Answer—

I note that the contract with the Plain English Foundation was signed under the former government whom deemed it to be an appropriate use of taxpayer money.

Answer-

The Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ) funds Specialist Homelessness Services (SHS) to support people facing or experiencing homelessness in NSW.

SHS can help women, men, young people, families, Aboriginal people and people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds. They help women experiencing domestic and family violence, people who are sleeping rough, young people leaving care, people with mental health issues, people living in unsafe conditions, older people, and people who identify as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Intersex or Queer.

Specific SHS are funded to provide services to individual cohorts, while others are funded to support a cross-section of people experiencing or at risk of homelessness.
