2. Compensation under Workers' Compensation Act:—Mr. Concannon asked the Vice-President of the Executive Council,—
Will he lay upon the Table of the House the official records of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Board, dealing with a recent decision of the High Court of Australia on an application lodged by the dependants of the late Mr. N. H. Astill, an ex-employee of the Board, for compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act?

7. Sydney Corporation (Amendment) Bill:—The President reported, and read the following Message from the Legislative Assembly:—

Mr. President,

The Legislative Assembly having this day passed a Bill, intituled "An Act to alter the dates upon which the triennial elections of aldermen of the City of Sydney shall be held; to extend the term of office of the aldermen of the City of Sydney at present holding office; to validate certain acts of the Municipal Council of Sydney and of the Governor in relation to the exercise of borrowing powers; to reduce the rate of charge on overdue rates under the Local Government Act, 1919, as amended by subsequent Acts; to amend the Sydney Corporation Act, 1902, the Sydney Corporation Amendment Act, 1905, the Local Government Act, 1919, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith,"—presents the same to the Legislative Council for its concurrence.
