The President said he had listened to the Honorable Member, Mr. Concannon, carcfully. On the whole he did not think he had gone beyond the limits of fair discussion on this matter. Some of the expressions he used might have been a little wide of the question under discussion but he thought the Honorable Member was in order.

Point of Order:—Mr. Farrar submitted that the motion was to rescind the resolution to refer the Bill to a select committee and that the Honorable Member, Mr. Concannon, was justifying the action of the Government of which he was a member. He held that the Honorable Member's remarks would be in order on the debate on the second reading of the Bill. The President said: The question was whether certain resolutions should

He understood the Honorable Member to argue that it was right and proper that the Bill should go to a Select Committee and that the delay involved in referring the Bill to a Select Committee was not important because, in his opinion, the work of the Board was being done efficiently.
