Brown and Abermain Seaham Collieries Limited and the Council of the Shire of Kearsley relating to a franchise for the supply of electric current for street and private lighting and for power in the towns of Kurri Kurri, Heddon Greta and Paxton within the Shire, and such adjacent areas or additions thereto as may be agreed upon from time to time between the Company and the Council and as may be approved by the Governor.
