The Legislative Council having this day agreed to the Bill, intituled "An Act to make further provision relating to the Hospitals Commission of New South Wales; to amend the Public Hospitals Act, 1929-1933, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith,"—returns the same to the Legislative Assembly without amendment.
