 - (g) the adequacy of the environmental impact assessment processes, reports, and associated community consultation; and
 - (h) any other related matter.
- (2) That, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the standing orders, the committee consist of twelve members comprising:
 - (a) Six members of the Legislative Assembly of whom
 - (i) two Government members, nominated in writing to the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly by the Government Whip
 - (ii) two Opposition members, nominated in writing to the Clerk of the Assembly by the Opposition Whip
 - (iii) one Greens member, nominated by the Greens in writing to the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly
 - (iv) one Crossbench member nominated by them in writing to the Clerk of the Legislative

Assembly;

- (b) and six members of the Legislative Council, of whom
- (i) two Government members
 - (ii) two Opposition members
 - (iii) one Greens member
 - (iv) one Crossbench member.
- (3) That the Chair of the Committee be Jenny Leong, Member for Newtown, and the Deputy Chair of the Committee be elected at the first meeting.
