This document provides a summary of significant procedures and precedents in the Legislative Assembly. It is produced at the end of each sitting period. Where applicable the relevant standing orders are noted.

BILLS

8.1 Private Members' Bill received from the Legislative Council

A message from the Legislative Council was reported transmitting a private members' bill (Truth in Labelling (Free-Range Eggs) Bill) which had passed that House. The Assistant Speaker advised the House that the Speaker had received written authority from the Member in charge of the Bill (Dr John Kaye MLC) advising that the Member for Balmain would have carriage of the bill in the Legislative Assembly.

Standing Order 229(2)

(NB: The requirement for the Speaker to be advised which Legislative Assembly Member would take carriage of a private members' bill received from the Legislative Council was introduced to the Standing Orders in 2009. This amendment formalised the practice that had been followed in the House for some time. The requirement for the Speaker to be advised of which member in the Assembly would have carriage of a private members' bill received from the Council is necessary to ensure that the bill can move forward when called on. Prior to this, such a bill could sit on the Business Paper once reported but be at a procedural dead-end if no member had the carriage to progress it through the House).

BUSINESS

8.2 Private Members' Statements given by leave in between items of business

The Leader of the House obtained the leave of the House for the taking of up to 12 private members' statements after the conclusion of the motion accorded priority and prior to the commencement of government business.

Standing Order 108

8.4 Discussion of petition signed by 10,000 or more persons

Discussion proceeded on the subject matter of the petition signed by 10,000 or more persons that had been received by the House from certain citizens "requesting that 'Confucius Classrooms' be removed from schools and be replaced by an Australian-run organisation." In accordance with the sessional order, no question was put at the conclusion of the discussion.

8.5 Reference to the Independent Commission Against Corruption

Motion agreed to that:

- (1) This House request the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC) to inquire into and report with respect to:
 - a. The circumstances surrounding the application for an allocation to Doyles Creek Mining Pty Ltd of Exploration Licence No 7270 under the Mining Act 1992 (NSW) (Mining Act);
 - b. The circumstances surrounding the making of profits, if any, by the shareholders of NuCoal Resources NL as proprietors of Doyles Creek Mining Pty Ltd;

- c. Any recommended action by the New South Wales Government with respect to licences or leases under the Mining Act over the Doyles Creek area;
- d. Any recommended action by the New South Wales Government with respect to amendment of the Mining Act; and
- e. Whether the New South Wales Government should commence legal proceedings, or take any other action, against any individual or company in relation to the circumstances surrounding the allocation of Exploration Licence No 7270.
- (2) As deemed, necessary, the Commissioner may also inquire into any related matters.
- (3) A message be sent to the Legislative Council informing it that the Legislative Assembly has this day agreed to the resolution and, pursuant to section 73 of the Independent Commission Against Corruption Act 1988, requests the Legislative Council to pass a similar resolution.

Standing Order 34

Motion moved 'That the Minister for the Environment, and Minister for Heritage no longer enjoys the confidence of the House give she:

- (1) Failed to inform the public for more than 54 hours of the Hexavalent Chromium leak from the Orica chemical plant at Kooragang Island on 8 August 2011.
- (2) Failed to inform the public for more than 24 hours of the Ammonium Nitrate leak from the same Orica Chemical plant on 9 November 2011.
- (3) Neglected to speak to any representative of Orica about these extremely serious threats to public safety, including CEO Graeme Liebelt, who tried to contact her on at least three separate occasions.
- (4) Has admitted that she doesn't read documents before she signs them in her capacity as Minister.
- (5) Has demonstrated that she has no understanding of the legislation in her portfolio during budget estimates hearings.
- (6) Has lost the confidence of the people of New South Wales and is clearly incapable of performing her duties as Minister for the Environment, and Minister for Heritage.

Standing Orders were suspended to allow the debate on the motion of no confidence to be completed before other business was proceeded with and to reduce the speaking times for the debate.

The motion was negatived on division.

Mr Lang introduced himself and the Speaker allowed Mr Lang to be sworn without first having been formally introduced).
