Review of Student Transport Scheme

The Public Accounts Committee of the New South Wales parliament has determined that it will review the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) having regard to the transport needs of school students and budgetary developments for the State Government.

The review will consider:

- 1. The need for equitable and affordable transport access for students to attend school, with a specific consideration of issues important to rural and urban school commuters;
- 2. The relationship between SSTS and regular route bus services;
- 3. The impact of educational policies on the Department of Transport's expenditure;
- 4. Student safety and welfare; and
- 5. Other related matter that the Committee may find necessary to consider.

The Committee is concerned about the efficiency, economy and effectiveness of the current scheme and will hold in high regard the Government's policy commitment to equitable access for all students.

Current IPART Inquiry into Private Bus Fares



INDEPENDENT PRICING AND REGULATORY TRIBUNAL OF NEW SOUTH WALES

Determination of fares for taxis, private buses and private ferries

The Tribunal has been requested under section 9(1)(b) of its Act to assist the Minister for Transport in the setting of fares for taxi services (ref: 01/541), private buses (ref: 01/537) and private femies (ref: 01/539).

To assist stakeholders in making their submissions, the Tribunal will release an issues paper on the reviews in February 2002. This issues paper will include the terms of reference for each of the reviews and will identify key issues for comment. A closing date for submissions will be included in the issues paper.

Once registered by the Tribunal, copies of all public submissions will be available from the Tribunal's office or from its website (www.ipart.nsw.gov.au).

The Tribunal will make its fare recommendations to the Minister for Transport in June 2002.
