

The most recent statistics available from the NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research are to March 2019. All the tables below show figures from April 2013 to March 2019. The areas of interest are:

- The Kings Cross and Sydney CBD entertainment precincts
- A ring of suburbs¹ contiguous with these precincts, called the proximal displacement area. Locations bordering the lockout area: including all of Pyrmont (including the Star City Casino) and parts of the following suburbs: Darling Harbour, Ultimo, Chippendale, Haymarket, Surry Hills, Elizabeth Bay, Rushcutters Bay Potts Point and Darlinghurst.
- A group of four suburbs which have nightspots within easy reach of the Kings Cross and CBD entertainment precincts (Newtown, Coogee, Bondi Beach, Double Bay), called the distal displacement area
- The rest of NSW (excluding the areas mentioned above)

Note that the data presented below assigns all assaults occurring along the border between Kings Cross and Sydney CBD entertainment precincts to the Kings Cross precinct.

1. Can BOCSAR provide statistics on how many non-domestic assaults have occurred in the below areas?

- Kings Cross**
- Sydney CBD**
- Proximal displacement area**
- Distal displacement area**
- Rest of NSW**

2. Can the above statistics be broken down into alcohol related and non-alcohol related assaults? If so, can this breakdown be provided to the Committee?

NSW Police can choose to flag an assault as 'alcohol related'. 'Non-alcohol related' offences are the remainder of offences which are not flagged. The table below shows the number of non-domestic assaults recorded by the NSW Police in the five selected areas broken down by whether flagged as alcohol related or not for the seven years ending March 2019.

4. By what percent have non-domestic assaults increased or decreased since February 2014 in the following areas:

- a. Kings Cross
- b. Sydney CBD
- c. Proximal displacement area
- d. Distal displacement area
- e. Rest of NSW

The Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research (BOCSAR) have investigated the impact of the lockout reforms in several peer reviewed studies all of which found a significant decline in assaults in the Kings Cross and Sydney CBD Entertainment precincts corresponding to the implementation of the reforms.


The most recent published BOCSAR report (2019 and attached) examined the monthly count of non-domestic assaults recorded by the NSW Police Force from January 2009 to March 2019: a total of 123 months (61 months prior to lockout intervention and 62 months post the lockout intervention).

The study results are shown in the table below. These percentages are the change in non-domestic assaults we attribute to the lockouts controlling for pre-existing trends .

Distal displacement	Up 30.0%	476 more assaults

The study also estimated how many fewer non-domestic violence assaults occurred in the precincts in the 62 months following the Lockout intervention compared with our pre-reform forecast (and similarly the increase in assault volumes in the displacement sites). The decline in assaults in Kings Cross and the Sydney CBD precincts (1,350 fewer assaults) is larger than the increase in assaults in the displacement areas (up 955 assaults overall). This equates to a net benefit of 395 fewer assaults. Note that we have found that the impact of the Lockouts in the precincts is diminishing over time.

For questions 5-9 data is presented for Kings Cross and Sydney City Police Area Commands (PACs) as BOCSAR currently does not geo-code these type of offences to the specific lockout precincts. Map 1 shows the geographical boundaries of these PACs in reference to the King Cross and Sydney CBD entertainment precincts, plus also the relevant suburb boundaries. It can be seen that both PACs are larger than the precincts and include suburbs that fall within the proximal displacement area. Kings Cross PAC also includes a large section of the CBD Entertainment precinct.

This table shows the total number of persons of interest proceeded against by police for failing to comply with a move-on direction and also the subset of persons that received a fine only.

Question 6 provides data on all persons of interest proceeded against for non-compliance with move-on directions. Question 7 specifically examines the number of these refusals that relate to section 9(1) of the Summary Offences Act 1998 - continuation of intoxicated and disorderly behaviour following move on direction. Data in question 7 is therefore a subset of the figures provided in Table 6.
