Public Hearing – Administration of the 2019 NSW State Election

What were the issues coming out of the last state election? Accessible voting options? Secure voting technology? Counting processes? These are matters that the NSW Parliament's Electoral Matters Committee will consider as it conducts round two of public hearings for its inquiry into the administration of the 2019 NSW State election.

Committee Chair, Mr Lee Evans MP, today announced that the second public hearing will be held on 19 February 2020.

"Continuing our inquiry, we will hear from further stakeholders and experts, as we look at all aspects of the election process. This will include voting options, technological capabilities, and what may need to change or improve".

The Committee will hear from witnesses including electoral analyst, Mr Antony Green; academics with expertise in the area of electronic voting; and advocates for disability and accessibility stakeholders including Blind Citizens Australia; the Multicultural Disability Advocacy Association of NSW; and Homelessness NSW.

The hearing will be held at Parliament House, starting at 10:15am on Wednesday 19 February. Members of the public are welcome to attend or watch a live stream from the Parliament's website.
