## Media release - mobile speed camera enforcement in NSW

How is the mobile speed camera enforcement program promoting road safety in NSW?

The Joint Standing Committee on Road Safety is looking at the recent changes to the state's mobile speed camera program. Changes include increased enforcement hours, reduced high visibility livery on vehicles and removing warning signs.

"This inquiry will help us to gain insights into how mobile speed camera enforcement protects road users" said Committee Chair The Hon. Lou Amato MLC.

"We want to know what the community thinks about these changes in terms of how they promote and improve road safety. We also want to consider how the revenue from speeding fines is spent as part of the ongoing funding of safety initiatives."

The inquiry is considering the balance between using mobile speed cameras and direct enforcement by police. The inquiry will also look at the nature of enforcement contracts between the government and the private sector.
