Response to a Question on Notice received from Mr Chris Hanger, Deputy Secretary, Department of Regional NSW following the public hearing held on 7 May 2021

Question:

CLAYTON BARR: The projected volume of agribusiness that is going to go onto this Inland Rail to get to market is somewhere in the vicinity of 6 per cent of the total product on that line, is that correct?

Mr HANGER: I do not have the exact figures of agribusiness but we can take that on notice and come back with what we think the freight load would be on Inland Rail.
