One staff member commenced proceedings against the Commission in the Industrial Relations Commission. The proceedings were settled on a confidential basis.

Management projects and issues

A program of reforms was continued during the reporting period. Some of the more notable ones were as follows.

Policy review

The reporting period was one of extensive reviewing of the Commission's policies, practices and procedures. The Commission considered that an extensive review and rewriting of policy and procedure documents was timely and would produce more improvements than a more limited exercise of merely looking for errors. Generally, existing policies, practices and procedures were found to be substantially appropriate, but the process of review and rewriting, which is continuing, has produced, and continues to produce, greater clarity and refinement on a number of points, as well as some substantive changes.

In the course of reviewing its practices and procedures, both during the reporting period and in the previous year, the Commission asked a number of agencies for assistance by way of having access to those agencies' policy documents. All agencies approached assisted the Commission in this way (except the PIC).

A related exercise has been the (not yet completed) development of an internal 'Wiki' intranet site designed to identify, organize and present the numerous
