The NSW Public Accounts Committee has begun a program of preliminary inquiries into the efficiency of

state agency operations following a series of performance audits by the NSW Auditor General, Mr Peter

Achterstraat.

Chair of the Committee, Mr Jonathan O'Dea MP, wants all departments to know that the Committee is

very serious in supporting the Auditor General's reviews and is determined to ensure that government

departments address any recommendations for more efficient or effective service provision.

"The Committee is keen to do its job well and to complement the important work done by Mr Achterstraat

in ensuring sound financial management for the people of New South Wales," he said. "In following the

recommendations we can help to facilitate better and more efficient processes – a responsibility that we

take very seriously."

In addition, the Committee is researching topics for its own separate inquiries. Initially the Committee

will focus on eight specific areas of government activity, as identified by the Auditor General, Ministers

and Committee members. The areas range from energy provision to use of national parks, emergency

service resources and government procurement. The Committee will meet again on 26 August 2011 to

determine its inquiry program for the next six months.
