Bourke Shire Council wishes to make the following submission in regard to the Joint Standing Committee on Electoral Matters.

At the Ordinary Meeting of Council held on 23rd August 2010 Bourke Shire Council resolved to oppose public funding of Local Government Election Campaigns. The overiding reason for this opposition is that Bourke Shire Council is totally opposed to any party policital tickets and party policital platforms for Local Government Elections. Our Council has a long term practice of a strong committment to Local Government Elections not having joint candidate tickets and being totally devoid of any party political connections.

Our Council does not believe there is any necessity for Local Govenrment Candidates and parties to be assisted for Local Government Elections. In view of this Council does not wish to submit any further responses to questions 2 to 9 within the summary of the issues paper.

Council further resolved to advise that our Council strongly opposes the necessity of the Electoral Commission conducting Local Government Elections. Our Council is committed to the view that Local Government Elections should be run by the Local Government itself. By far the greatest cost of Local Government Elections at the moment is the cost to Council associated with running the election, all of which is beyond the control of our own Local Council. This far exceeds the cost for candidates. These costs have been escalating over recent Local Government Elections and are getting to the point of being totally unrealistic relative to the number of potential voters in the Council area.

Our Council trusts that within the terms of reference of the Joint Standing Committee on electoral matters, this issue of reverting the conduct of Local Government Elections to the Local Government in lieu of the Electoral Commission to be taken into serious consideration.
