Re: Downstream Gas Supply/Availability in NSW

In 1998 a mains gas line (not sure if high pressure or low pressure) was put in through Londonderry.

This line was extended from the John Moroney Correction Centre (2 Northern Road Berkshire Park) up to and along Carrington Road Londonderry right through to the Londonderry "village" area – going around Muscherry Road and past the Londonderry Public School and across Londonderry Road to Torkington Road.

This line then went straight down Torkington to the Sand Quarry where the gas was going to be used to dry specialty sands.

I enquired at the time regarding house connections for our street (Tralee Road) which is parallel to and one block over from Carrington Road.

I am also enclosing correspondence regarding possible connections to the village area of Londonderry.

The AGL Network did not seem all that interested – stating that it was mainly for industrial use.

Back in 1998 there were at least 10 houses in our street that would have happily hooked up to natural gas. We all had wood-burning fires and thought that gas would cut pollution etc.. not to mention all other houses in the general area of the gas main.

Londonderry has increased in housing/population size considerably since 1998 and house gas connections (if offered at a realistic cost) would be very welcome in 2013.
