SUBMISSION: INQUIRY INTO ACCESS TO TRANSPORT FOR SENIORS AND DISADAVANTAGED PEOPLE IN RURAL AND REGIONAL NSW

I refer to your recent letter inviting Parkes Shire Council to provide a submission to the Legislative Assembly Committee on Community Services for the above inquiry.

Parkes Shire Council welcomes any government assistance that will facilitate greater access to transport for seniors and disadvantaged people in the Parkes Shire. Seniors and disadvantaged people in the Parkes Shire will benefit from:
