The commuter parking at Schofields has now become beyond ridiculous. When the new station opened, the carpark was overflowing onto street parking before 8am. With the plan of over 6,000 houses to be built between Burdekin Road and Schofields Rd and Ridgeline Road and Railway Terrace (forget the other side of Schofields), that this carpark was never going to cope with the potential demands of the immediate community.
