The Department of Premier and Cabinet (DPC) supports the majority of the recommendations made and intends to update the *Unsolicited Proposals Guide for Submission and Assessment (February 2014)* (the "Guide") accordingly. DPC has prepared a draft updated Guide for Cabinet consideration. In order to update the Guide, the approval of the Cabinet Infrastructure Committee (CIC) is required. NorthConnex was an unsolicited proposal and therefore evaluated in accordance with the Guide.
