To the Committee of inquiry into Religious Freedom:

In Australia, we have always enjoyed the ability to pursue our day to day activities with a minimum of interference or restriction by the state through the out working of our laws. We are all aware that as individuals, we personally have our own version of the way we see the world. We surely all want to be able to be free to think and do things in accordance with our view of culture, and to experience a minimum of restrictions in so doing. Traditionally this has been associated with phrases such as having 'a right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion.'

As we all enjoy being in the company of others who usually have a similar way of thinking, this means that everyone should have the right to live out their religion or belief in a teaching and by participating in the practice of worship, or indeed NOT to do so. We also do not expect the state to interfere in such practice except where it is likely to seriously and directly affect others.
