As a member of the community and daily commuter on NSW roads I want to voice my concerns to the removal of warning signs of mobile speed cameras. I feel that the removal of the warning signs is to the detriment of the community and the road safety effort as a whole.

By removing the warning signs drivers are no longer prompted to correct their speed and modify their behaviour, rather they are unaware and continue the undesirable behaviour. More visibility in high-risk locations is a better alternative to ensure better road safety.

Also, drivers are scanning the road more looking for potential mobile speed cameras rather than focusing solely on driving. I have experienced drivers in front of me slam on their brakes due to mistaking a white ute on the side of the road for a mobile speed camera.
