


Learner Driver Mentor Program (LDMP) Online Training

Youthsafe's LDMP online training platform has recently completed its pilot phase.

Results have been extremely positive and show the platform:

- Provides far greater reach to meet volunteer driver mentors' training needs.
- Allows for more flexible, immersive learning.
- Reduces training costs by removing travel and accommodation costs of trainers.
- Facilitates greater engagement and collaboration between participants and training organisations.





Youthsafe & LDMPs

Youthsafe have been involved in the LDMP space for many years. Contributing to Government enquiry into the need for these types of programs. Youthsafe also developed the LDMP Development Guide to assist community groups when starting up such programs. The guide has since been digitised by Youthsafe.

Through this new platform participants are first introduced to Youthsafe and the important work undertaken in the road safety setting.

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How collaborating helps young people from disadvantaged backgrounds attain their driver licence.





WHO IS YOUTHSAFE?

Youthsafe is a not-for-profit organisation that provides industry training and community support in the field of youth safety and wellbeing.

Youthsafe address risk taking and unintentional injury in the four settings where young people are most likely to be injured:

- · On the roads
- At work
- Playing sport
- · While socialising

On the roads

Youthsafe works collaboratively with Government, community groups and others to develop innovative road safety initiatives to addres youth road safety. This includes information and training in the Learner Driver Mentor Program space.






Navigation

Page layout is consistent throughout the training.

A navigation map at the beginning highlights the uniformity of each page to give users assurance of approach; particularly important for those new to online training.





Units

There are six units which cover:

- Graduated Licensing Scheme (GLS)
- Young People & Risk
- Who Is a Mentor?
- Effective Communication
- · Safer Driving Behaviours The Driving Test
- The Learner Log Book.

A wrap up page provides one final review and next steps while an embedded form invites users to offer feedback to inform improvement.

Users have access to a downloadable Certificate of Completion.



What is the Graduated Licensing Scheme (GLS)?

The GLS allows the gradual easing of restrictions as the novice driver gains experience and develops their driving skills, knowledge and attitude.

What is the GLS?

Young drivers under the age of 25 must go through the NSW GLS. One of the biggest tasks in the GLS is that learner drivers have to log 120 hours of on-road driving experience supervised by a fully licensed NSW driver. The GLS is a stepped approach to helping the young person become fully licensed.

The GLS:


- · Accommodates the characteristics of young people
- · Sets boundaries and gradually reduces them
- · Provides opportunity and guidance to develop multiple experiences
- · Engages support and supervision
- · Allows time for greater maturity to develop



Audio key points

Each unit has an audio file which revises and emphasises the unit content.

It also provides additional insight from a Youthsafe professional who works in the LDMP space.






Unit tests

The completion of each unit requires the participant to complete a test.

Progression can only occur after a score of 100%.

If not successful first time round, the participant can go back, review the unit and take the test again.





Certificate of completion

Upon completion of all units and tests each participant receives a personalised Certificate of Completion.




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Screen recording

The screen recording (right) captures a brief example of the training platform from the beginning through to the test at the end of Unit 1.

The recording demonstrates the:

- Ease of use
- Friendly interface
- Clear directions
- · Easily digestible information
- Simple testing and instant results



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
