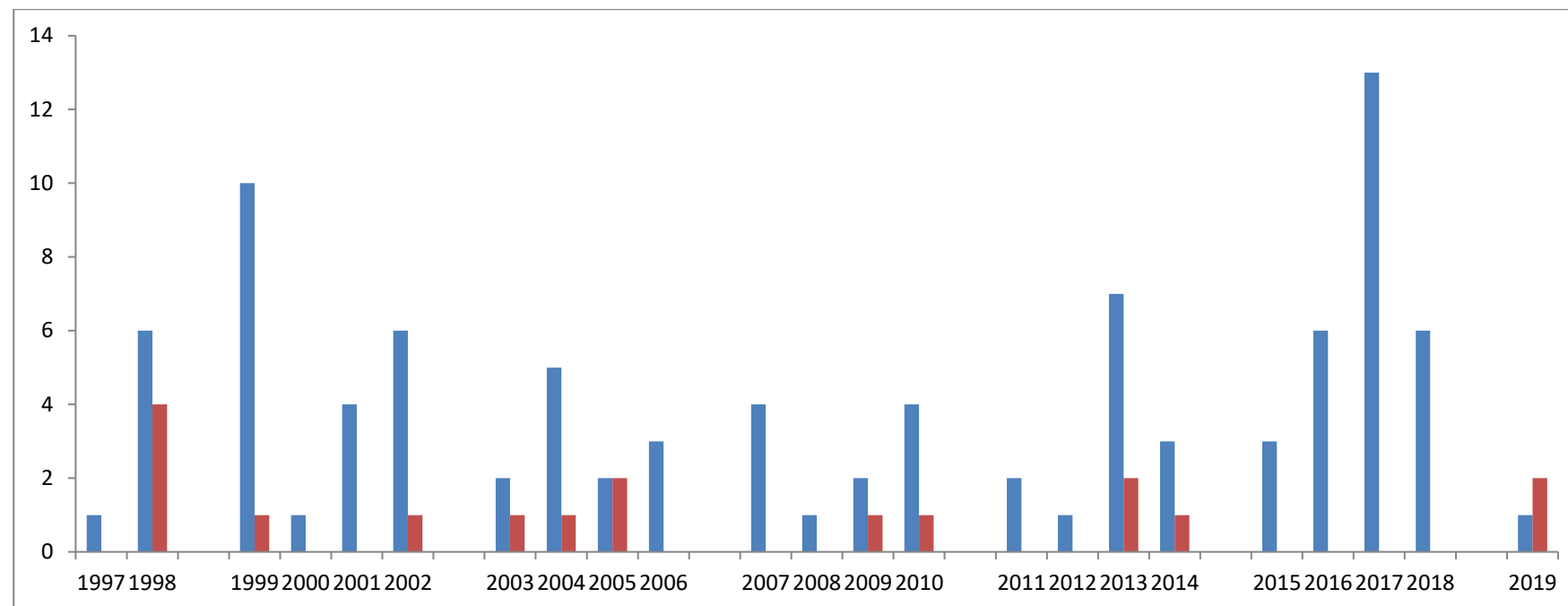


Legislative Council: Motions to disallow statutory rules and regulations since 1995
