    - (e) How many patients presented with symptoms of harmful use;
    - (f) How many patients presented with late onset psychosis related to cannabis;
    - (g) How many patients presented with any sort of substance issues (including cannabis); and
    - (h) How many patients were treated overall by the Emergency Response department?

### Answer-

(a) - (f)

Information is not collected with this level of specificity.

- (g) 29,142 patients presented to NSW public hospital emergency departments where the administrative record identified substance issues.

#### Answer-

I am advised that that decreases in revenue are largely due to the impact of policy changes associated with the ending of the VET FEE-HELP scheme. Additionally, the uncapping of university places had a significant influence on VET enrolments nationwide. The NSW Government is responding to this trend through \$285 million for 100 000 fee-free apprenticeships from 1 July 2018, along with 100 000 fee-free TAFE and VET courses from 1 January 2020.

## Answer-

I am advised that the Student Management Services system has reached the end of Design and Build phase. I understand the remaining work is being transitioned from DxC Red Rock to TAFE NSW's ICT team to deliver the final stages and fine tune the system.

I am informed that TAFE NSW has rolled out the first two stages of the Student Management System including an Integrated Student General Enquiry Form and Customer Relationship System. I understand that several improvements to the existing EBS system were implemented in August 2019 to assist teachers with their day to day activities including the recording of assessment and marking attendance. TAFE NSW has also committed to rolling out a single instance of EBS to offer further improvements for staff by mid next year.

I am further advised that a pilot of the Student Management Services system is planned for technical readiness in November 2020 with full implementation dates to be confirmed post this pilot.

I am advised that there are currently no complaints regarding the use of EBS by students enrolling in 2020 offerings.

TAFE NSW provides NCVER with data on students, course, subject training activity and outcome details in separate files in the required Australian Vocational Education and Training Management Information Statistical Standard format.

I am finally advised that information on TAFE NSW enrolment numbers is available in the "Our Performance" section of the TAFE NSW annual report available at https://www.tafensw.edu.au/corporate/annual-report.
