## Inquiry into possible contempt arising from the inquiry into the proposal to develop Rosehill Racecourse

## **TERMS OF REFERENCE**

- (1) That the Special Report and recommendation of the Select Committee on the Proposal to Develop Rosehill Racecourse be referred to the Privileges Committee for inquiry and report.
  - The terms of reference for the inquiry were referred to the committee by the Legislative Council on 25 September 2024<sup>1</sup>.
- (2) That the unauthorised disclosure of the draft minutes of the meeting of the Select Committee on the Proposal to Develop Rosehill Racecourse on Friday 29 November 2024 be referred to the Privileges Committee, and that the following matters be investigated as part of the existing inquiry in relation to a possible contempt arising from the Select Committee inquiry:
  - (a) whether the Privileges Committee's unauthorised disclosure guidelines have been breached on this occasion,
  - (b) whether the guidelines remain fit for purpose, and
  - (c) any other related matter concerning this unauthorised disclosure.

The additional terms of reference for the inquiry were referred to the committee by the President on 6 December 2024.<sup>2</sup>
