We reply to the questions on notice as follows:

We have no relationship with NSWALC. Our role is best described as being outsourced the consultancy regarding economic develop, providing expertise in legals, finance, town and urban planning, architectural etc. That is, a (multidisciplined) service provider rather than an institution. We do not represent indigenous interest generally, but are solely focused on promoting economic development opportunities.

ULC and UFPS is national, not state in its approach and has established relationships and memberships across the Asia-Pacific indigenous organisations.

At the state level, we have 33 NSW Land Councils in various levels of membership/briefs of representation on certain matters. The nature of the briefs are confidential. Of the full members that have no restrictions regarding disclosure, are Illawarra LALC, Merrimans LALC, Awabakal LALC, Tharawal LALC, Dubbo LALC, and Young LALC. Other members are not Land Councils established under the NSW Aborginal Land Rights Act, but Indigenous Land Corporations, and Traditional Owner Groups whether as court-appointed applicants such as Gomoroi, or incorporated entities such as Culpra Station.
