FW: Supplementary water

John,

aid you wanted to know how Supplementary Flow Events work.

- 1. On most occasions when a Supplementary Event is announced, it is available for both GS Surplus Flows (the old off-allocation) and Supplementary Water Allocation (SWA). On rare occasions, only once I can ever remember, it is restricted to SWA.
- 2. I determine the type of water you use. Where possible I will first debit your GS Surplus account, then your SWA account, and then your on-allocation account.
- 3. GS Surplus Water is available when your Effective Available Water (EAW) <=70%, that is, your GS Allocation plus any carryover >15%. For your SWAA the EAW is 17% + 0% (your carryover is < 15%) = 17%.
- 4. The limit you can take is 85% less the EAW. For your SWAA this is 85 17 = 68%.
- 5. In total you have available -17% (on-allocation) + 68% (GS surplus) + 10.5% (carryover) = 95.5%. SWA is in addition to this.
- 6. As GS increases, the limit in 3 above decreases. Should you exceed the limit at any time during the year because it has decreased, I will first move the excess to any SWA balance and then to on-allocation.
- 7. SWA can be accessed at any time when there is a Supplementary Event announced by MI. The EAW limit does not apply.
