FIRST REVIEW OF THE DUST DISEASES AND LIFETIME CARE AND SUPPORT SCHEMES

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The NSW Upper House's Standing Committee on Law and Justice has completed its first reviews of the Dust Diseases and Lifetime Care and Support schemes and has tabled two reports today detailing its findings and recommendations.

The committee previously reviewed the schemes in 2014. Since then, the NSW Government legislatively reformed the state's insurance schemes, resulting in structural and administrative changes. This is the committee's first examination of these two schemes since the implementation of the reforms.

The Hon Shayne Mallard, committee Chair, said: "The committee is pleased to report that both schemes are performing well. There is, however, some scope for improvement and our recommendations reflect this.'

Mr Mallard added: In relation to the Dust Diseases scheme, we have responded to calls to modernise application processes by recommending a 24/7 application and receipt process. Additionally, we have made recommendations to consider the establishment of a national data collection system and to also augment current review mechanisms for claimants.'

The committee's recommendations regarding the Lifetime Care and Support scheme focus on improving the client experience. Mr Mallard noted: 'We have made several recommendations to promote flexible delivery of treatment and care services, enhance access to information for scheme applicants, and improve dispute resolution processes."
