The Department of Planning and Environment has required Centennial Springvale to lodge a total of \$ 6 million in bonds to cover any long-term impacts to swamps under the swamp off-set policy of December 2016:

- 107. How did the Department itemise and detail the calculation of offset liability for each of the three bonds that Centennial Springvale has paid for long-term swamp impacts?
- 108. Is the Department's "negligible environmental consequences" trigger criteria for release of the \$6 million bond for swamp offset payment based on measurements which would indicate a lowering of shallow groundwater levels in a swamp from longwall mining?
- 109. Now that Springvale consent SSD5594 of September 2015 is invalid, what happens to this bond money?
- 110. Are biological factors, such as the presence or absence of threatened species, poor "negligible environmental consequences" triggers for swamp offsets as such animal populations may linger for years only to be extinguished in a drought or wildfire?

- 111. Once the near-surface rocks are fractured by longwall mining, the damage is permanent and there is no evidence of recovery of ground water levels in a swamp following an observed decline from longwall mining, so is it unnecessary to wait for a period of 12 months to release the bond for swamp offsets?
- 112. Will the Minister for Planning ensure that \$2 million is paid for each swamp Centennial Springvale damages by longwall mining?
- 113. Why has the Minister for Planning not ordered Centennial to stop undermining any more swamps given the extreme risk of permanent damage?

Redbank

114. Given that the Hawkesbury Mayor was named in ICAC and was on the planning committee, the developer has allegedly given buyers false information, why is the Redbank development continuing?
