Existing data suggests that more than half of those people who are facing a *mandatory interlock order* will serve the full 5 year disqualification.

Under the proposed reforms, *mandatory interlock provisions* will be enlivened upon conviction for the first Mid Range PCA offence. In the same period (April 2014 to March 2018) there were 19752 convictions recorded for this offence.
