Dear Kate

I am writing in response to the Committee's Supplementary question on Notice: What is the definition of "Live Music"?

LGNSW has contacted a number of councils seeking their views on this question. While we have not done an extensive survey of councils, there does not appear to be one universally accepted definition of "live music".

I therefore refer you to the City of Sydney's Live Music and Performance Taskforce, which was convened in 2012. As part of its work, the Taskforce commissioned the City of Sydney Live Music and Performance Action Plan March 2014. https://www.cityofsydney.nsw.gov.au/ data/assets/pdf file/0007/232783/Live-Music-and-Performance-Action-Plan.pdf

In this plan, it states:

"The Taskforce limited its focus to activity involving live performance events for audiences at venues and in the public domain, with a particular focus on small- to medium-scale venues and activity. 'Live music' was defined broadly to include music performed by singers and instrumentalists in bars, pubs, theatres, restaurants and clubs as well as in non-traditional venues including carparks, warehouses and shops, and in public spaces in urban areas."

"Live performance' was defined as other forms of performance including, but not limited to, theatre, dance, cabaret, drag, stand-up comedy and spoken-word events."

"To date there has been little differentiation between the characteristics of live performance and entertainment focused on recorded music. While recognising the importance of nightclubs, DJ-led parties and other similar activities to the city's night-time economy and reputation as a global city, the role of this taskforce was contained to the issues facing live musicians and performers."

This definition has been accepted by the councils we contacted as adequately covering the definition of "live music".
