52. How much has been spent to date on transaction costs for the Sydney Motorway Corporation transaction, and with which firms and for what services?

Answer: -

The SMC Transaction resulted in \$9.3 billion worth of proceeds for the people of NSW to be spent on roads, rail, schools and hospitals. As at June 2018, costs associated with the transaction amounts to \$53.7 million and are spread amongst a range of specialist advisors and consultants who were engaged to ensure the best outcome for the State. Expected total advisor costs represent less than 1% of the transaction proceeds. These advisory and consultancy services included:

- Goldman Sachs Australia for financial advisory services
- PwC for accounting and tax advisory services
- Allens for legal advisory services
- Ansarada for secure data room provision
- Telstra for cloud storage
- OCM for probity advisory services
- Turner and Townsend and GHD Advisory for technical advisory services

- SMC sale costs including:
 - o GTA for traffic advisory services
 - o BIS Oxford Economics for economic advisory services
 - o Ansarada for a secure data room
 - o Baker McKenzie and Ashurst for legal advisory services
 - o PwC for model review services
 - o SMC staff and contractor costs and related expenses
- Contractors
- Government agency staff costs and sale related expenses.
