**2. What specific qualifications is the document on the Department of Education's website about prequalified service providers for student wellbeing referring to when it states that to be put onto the prequalified list each service provider must supply licenses, accreditations, registrations held and the qualifications of key staff?**

The list of prequalified service providers was established in 2019 to assist schools locate services and agencies that offered programs to improve student attendance and engagement. The Department followed NSW Government's procurement processes to create this panel.

These providers offer a variety of services and may include the delivery of targeted wellbeing programs based on the identified needs of the school community.

The Prequalification Scheme Agreement states that services are to be provided by suitably qualified professionals. This was part of the assessment criteria. The providers' staff were required to hold post school qualifications in a relevant discipline or have appropriate experience.

In addition, providers were required to demonstrate that personnel have the knowledge, skills and experience to provide engagement and attendance services to children and young people, including:

- Knowledge of cognitive, emotional and behavioural development of children and young people.
- Supporting children and young people using evidence-based interventions.
- Well-developed interpersonal and communication skills, including report writing.
- Ability to work collaboratively with school executive, teachers, parents/carers and other key stakeholders to deliver evidence-based services for students.
- Appropriate cultural knowledge and skills to engage with specific groups of young people in ways that are culturally relevant, safe and appropriate.

**3. Are the people who are actually running the program in face to face workshops qualified?**

The Prequalification Scheme Agreement states that services are to be provided by suitably qualified professionals. This was part of the assessment criteria. The providers' staff were required to hold post school qualifications in a relevant discipline or have appropriate experience.

4. **The 2019-2020 NSW Education Budget has allocated \$88.4 million to hire a full time psychologist and social worker in every NSW government high school. Could the Minister advise:**
- a) **the number of primary schools provided with a psychologist,**
  - b) **the number of high schools provided with a psychologist,**
  - c) **the number of primary schools provided with a social worker,**
  - d) **the number of high schools provided with a social worker.**

The NSW Government committed funding to provide a full time counselling allocation and a full time Student Support Officer to every public high school. Student Support Officers are required to hold a diploma or higher qualification in youth work, social work, welfare or related discipline.

- a) All NSW primary schools receive a school counselling service allocation. The school counselling service may be provided by a school counsellor or a school psychologist.
- b) All NSW high schools receive a school counselling service allocation. The school counselling service may be provided by a school counsellor or a school psychologist. As part of the \$88.4 million commitment, all high schools will have a full time school counselling allocation by June 2023.
- c) As part of the \$88.4 million election commitment, all high schools in NSW will be allocated a full-time ongoing Student Support Officer between July 2020 and June 2023. Primary schools are not being allocated Student Support Officers through this commitment.
- d) In July 2020, 183 schools were allocated an ongoing Student Support Officer position. A further 207 schools will be allocated a Student Support Officer position in July 2021. In July 2022, the final 74 schools will be allocated a Student Support Officer.

5. **What controls and measures has the Minister introduced to ensure that the social workers and psychologists referred to in 1 above will:**
- a) **not provide instruction or advise on ideologically-based and political material that is inconsistent with the wishes and values of parents,**
  - b) **Ensure that parents are fully consulted and aware of their child's visits with the social worker/psychologist.**
- a) All personnel working in schools, including external service providers must comply with all laws, regulations and departmental policies, including the code of conduct policy and procedures and the controversial issues in schools policy.
  - b) Where appropriate, parents or carers are notified of the participation of students in the delivery of curriculum, school programs and activities, presentations including those provided by external service providers.

**6. What parental engagement programs and incentives has the Minister introduced to ensure that parents are engaged with their child's education in the infant and primary school years?**

The Department values opportunities to work with parents and carers in supporting student learning. The following resources are examples of support provided to enhance the engagement of parents with their child's education:

The Everyday Maths Hub (at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/teaching-and-learning/curriculum/key-learning-areas/mathematics/everyday-maths-hub/#%3Cspan2>) is an engaging and dynamic online platform for parents and carers of children in Kindergarten through to Year 10. It aims to support and encourage family conversations about the relevance and usefulness of mathematics in everyday life and build on in class learning.

Learning from home - learning packages for parents and carers (at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/teaching-and-learning/learning-from-home/learning-at-home>) contain explicit teaching activities with self-guided videos to compliment the learning program provided by schools. They have been developed for parents and carers to use to ensure learning continuity in response to learning from home.

The Literacy and Numeracy website (at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/teaching-and-learning/curriculum/literacy-and-numeracy>) has resources to assist parents and carers in supporting their child's development of literacy and numeracy skills. They include 'Helping your child with literacy and numeracy at home'; and 'Handwriting in the early years – a guide for parents and practice sheets for letters'.

Resources for families (at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/teaching-and-learning/curriculum/early-learning/resources-for-families>) contain a variety of resources such as Learning outcome cards, translated resources, resources to support Aboriginal families and podcasts, that provide ideas to engage in learning at home through everyday experiences. The early learners' animations for families, explore the learning that happens in the early years of a child's life at home and early childhood services, the important role families play in their child's learning and how this learning supports a child's lifelong educational journey.

Schools also continue to provide a range of opportunities for parents to engage with the school and the decision making process to support their child's education. This includes participation in school Parents and Citizens Associations, opportunities to attend meet the teacher and information nights and providing feedback to help inform the school's situational analysis and School Improvement Plan. Schools may also include parents in a number of school-based activities to help support teaching and learning and various school committees to assist in making decisions around school-related issues and programs.

**7. What is the number of teachers on extended paid leave, and what is the cost to the Education budget of these?**

As at 11 March 2021, there were 1,526 teachers on extended paid leave (commonly referred to as Long Service Leave). There are no costs to the Department of

Education's budget, as the leave is paid from provisions accumulated during the period of each teacher's service.

**8. What measures is the Minister taking to ensure that NSW teachers return to the class-room and face to face teaching? What is the time line of these measures?**

Leave provisions for NSW public school teachers are provided for in a range of Determinations made pursuant to section 13 of the *Teaching Service Act 1980*.

Permanent and temporary teachers receive extended leave in accordance with Part 4, Division 5 of the *Teaching Service Act 1980* and Determination 6 of 2006.

Permanent and temporary teachers have access to extended leave (otherwise known as long service leave) following the completion of seven years of service. Long Service Leave, as provided by the *Long Service Leave Act 1955*, is only available to casual teachers. The extended leave accrual rate is:

- a) 44 working days for 10 years of service. Extended leave is accessible on a pro-rata basis after seven years of service;
- b) One working day per year after 10 years of service;
- c) Pro rata accrual for periods of part time work, including work under a part time leave without pay arrangement.

**Inspectorate**

**9. 'Measurement and outcome-based funding in New South Wales schools' Inquiry, particularly the recommendation "To establishing a School Inspectorate as an independent unit undertaking regular inspections of classroom practices, teacher quality and school management". To ensure that education systems are transparent and do not self-investigate', will the minister commit to the creation of an independent Inspectorate for NSW?**

The NSW Government noted this recommendation in its initial response in August 2020 (ref: Recommendation 37).

The NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) inspection functions are being improved, focusing on teaching and learning. Departmental oversight will be increased through enhanced school planning and public reporting, external validation through the School Excellence Framework, stronger performance and development processes for principals and teachers, and significantly enhanced system level public reporting.

International evidence indicates that the success of classroom oversight-style inspectorate models is dependent on the quality of support provided to schools to address the issues identified by inspectors. Not all nations with inspectorates demonstrate high performance. Both the United Kingdom and New Zealand systems, which feature classroom oversight-style inspectorates, have statistically similar PISA performance to Australia. Inspectorate functions relating to teacher accreditation and school registration in NSW are performed independently by NESA. NESA monitors school compliance with legislated requirements across all school systems, including policies and procedures around fair and consistent teacher accreditation judgements, and the implementation of teaching programs.

Evidence suggests that the strongest impact on teaching quality comes from comprehensive and well-designed systems for teacher evaluation, which include more frequent and specific teacher evaluations alongside better and more targeted performance development. In NSW, the professional oversight of Directors, Educational Leadership and Principals, School Leadership provides this external validation of self-assessment against the Schools Excellence Framework, in addition to the ongoing guidance and feedback provided to teachers by principals, and to principals by Principals, School Leadership.

10. **To what degree does the Minister agree in conjunction with the recommendations of the ‘Measurement and outcome-based funding in New South Wales schools’ Inquiry, that such an inspectorate should be based more upon the Scottish ‘Education Scotland’ model of Inspectorate that is collegial and supportive, rather than the English Ofsted model?**

#### **Children with a disability and abuse.**

Misconduct has a very broad definition under employment legislation and the types of conduct that may constitute misconduct are more clearly defined in the Department of Education’s Code of Conduct.

Sustained misconduct means misconduct has been proven to have occurred.

In circumstances where the conduct of an employee may not amount to misconduct but may still demonstrate poor practice, the employment legislation permits remedial action to be taken in order to assist the employee to address the practice that resulted in allegations of misconduct being made. This means remedial action can be used for minor sustained misconduct or for matters that were not sustained to be misconduct but may amount to poor practice.

**Sexual offence:** an offence of a sexual nature under a law of the State, another State, a Territory, or the Commonwealth, committed against, with or in the presence of a child. The alleged offence does not have to be the subject of a criminal investigation or charges.

**Sexual misconduct:** any conduct towards a or in the presence of a child that is sexual nature that includes for example, descriptions of sexual acts, sexual comments or conversations, comments that express a desire to act in a sexual manner towards a child.

**Assault:** physical force without lawful justification or conduct which causes a child to apprehend the immediate and unlawful use of physical force against them.

**Ill-treatment:** unreasonable and seriously inappropriate, improper inhumane or cruel conduct.

**Emotional/psychological harm:** to engage in conduct which is proven to cause psychological or emotional harm

**Neglect:** a significant failure by a person which parental responsibility or authority or an employee if the child is in their care, to provide adequate and proper food, supervision or a failure to fulfil a duty or obligation resulting in actual harm or where the failure is likely to cause harm including failing to protect a child from abuse.

**Crossing the professional boundary:** failure to observe the professional boundary but without the presence of overt sexual misconduct.

14. **How many child protection complaints against a staff member must be made before a full investigation of said staff member is initiated, and said staff member is relocated away from non-verbal children? *An example is of a staff member in the Newcastle area, currently at Kotara South Public School, with different, multiple child protection complaints brought up in 2007, 2013, 2015 and 2016 from different schools, yet the staff member remains in place.***

The Department provides a full-time inquiry service to Principals, staff, students and members of the school community to report allegations of harm against children or young people. Every allegation reaching the threshold for reportable conduct is reported to the Office of the Children's Guardian (OCG) within 24 hours, as required under the *Children's Guardian Act 2019*.

A senior officer assesses every reportable allegation. The Department manages any risk to students and proceeds to investigate all reportable allegations. Investigations are conducted with procedural fairness and are oversighted by the OCG.

The information obtained in every investigation is assessed by an independent decision maker and outcomes are based on the available evidence. Where students are non-verbal the Department uses whatever sources of evidence are available to it, though these investigations can and do pose a challenge.

Where a finding of misconduct is made and the decision maker is considering dismissal or demotion, there is consultation about the outcome with a Disciplinary Advisory Panel, which includes a panel of senior officers of the Department. The role of the Panel is to advise as to whether dismissal or demotion is proportionate and warranted.

The Department cannot comment on the example provided.

**15. What practical steps to further safeguard children with a disability in NSW Education schools have been undertaken since the Parliamentary Inquiry into Students with a disability or special needs in New South Wales schools?**

The safety, wellbeing and welfare of every child in NSW public schools is of paramount importance. The practical steps to further safe guard children with disability since the Parliamentary Inquiry into Students with a disability or special needs in NSW schools includes:

- Mandating that all staff complete Child Protection Training annually. The training has customised pathways for primary and secondary school staff, preschool and early childhood staff, special religious and ethics education teachers, Assisted School Travel Program staff, volunteers in schools and corporate staff.
- Updating Child Protection Training each year so that it covers any changes in policy and legislative requirements as well as emerging issues that impact on their responsibilities.
- Implementing improvements in the way the Department responds to concerns, complaints and allegations of staff misconduct. This ensures we have robust systems for responding to allegations of staff misconduct.
- Updating the Department's guidelines for the management of conduct and performance and expanding our preliminary investigation team, which pays particular attention to matters involving students with disability.

- Developing e-learning modules to build the knowledge and skills of school-based staff to effectively manage any concerns or issues families may raise. These build on existing professional learning resources which guide staff in responding to complaints, including making the complaint process easy and accessible, so that parents and carers of children with disability can engage with schools at an early stage.
- Building staff capability to meet the needs of students with disability. This includes mandating Disability Standards for Education training for all school leaders. This ensures staff understand their legal obligations to make sure students living with disability can access and participate in education on the same basis as students without disability.

**20. In 2020, there was significant concern over the most vulnerable children (Indigenous and those with a disability) being disproportionately excluded. Has any change been implemented to understand why such bias appear apparent?**

The Department is concerned about the disproportionately high suspension rates for Aboriginal students and students with disability.

The Department values the ongoing partnership with the NSW Aboriginal Education Consultative Group Incorporated (NSW AECG) and is committed to continuing to strengthen this relationship. The Department recognises the NSW AECG as the peak community advisory body on Aboriginal education at all levels and in all stages of planning and decision making.

The Department is committed to respectfully listening and learning from the NSW AECG, and its network of Regional and Local AECGs to improve educational outcomes for Aboriginal learners.

The Partnership Agreement is based on a genuine and practical approach to working together to improve outcomes for Aboriginal learners by ensuring that they have access to an education and training system that values their cultural heritage and identity, and supports their learning and career development through quality teaching

practices, relevant policies and strategies and inclusive curriculum and training programs.

The Student Behaviour Strategy was released on 8 March 2021 and incorporates the findings and recommendations from independent reviews and is informed by evidence reviews, data analysis of suspensions and stakeholder consultation over three years.

The Strategy encompasses three key areas: practice, support for schools, teachers, students and parents, and ongoing improvement and systems reform. The Strategy's approach is based on evidence of best practice, including a greater emphasis on prevention, early intervention and teaching students' new ways to manage their own behaviour.

As part of the Student Behaviour Strategy, the Department has already released behaviour support resources from Day 1, Term 1, 2021. This includes five professional learning courses, new behaviour specialist positions working within the team around a school, and a behaviour support toolkit for parents, teachers and school leaders.

Other parts of the Strategy will have a phased implementation during 2021 and beyond. This includes additional targeted professional learning identified in collaboration with stakeholders, additional expert practitioners within the expert panel of service providers available for all schools using school funding, and co-commissioning opportunities with other agencies.

21. **How many legal actions have been taken against/involved staff and schools in regard the treatment of children with a disability in NSW public schools in the last three years (2018, 2019 and 2020)? *Legal actions made involve allegations originating from years before and my not be not just involve discrimination.***

Insurance and Care NSW (iCare) operates the Insurance for NSW self-insurance scheme and administers the NSW Treasury Managed Fund on behalf of NSW Government. It holds the data for NSW government agencies on legal claims. The answer to this question was sourced from information provided by iCare, as follows:

22. **Of those legal actions involving against staff and schools for the treatment of children with a disability in NSW public schools in the last three years (2017, 2018 and 2019) where the department paid out settlements or discontinuations, involving complaints about staff, how many staff were reprimanded? *Legal actions made involve allegations originating from years before and my not be not just involve discrimination.***

Any legal action taken against the Department of Education is treated separately from any investigation of misconduct. Complaints made as part of legal action may not amount to reportable conduct and therefore may not elicit investigation or disciplinary action.

All allegations of a child protection nature are individually assessed by trained child protection investigators. Following investigation, should an employee be found to have engaged in misconduct, appropriate disciplinary action, ensuring the safety and welfare of children, is taken.

Of the complaints identified in answer to question 21, only two matters are known to the Professional and Ethical Standards Directorate (PES), one in 2019 and one in 2020. No action was taken in either case.

23. **Of those legal actions involving against staff and schools for the treatment of children with a disability in NSW public schools in the last three years (2018, 2019 and 2020) where the department paid out settlements or discontinuations, involving complaints about staff, how many staff were transferred away from children with a disability? *Legal actions made involve allegations originating from years before and my not be not just involve discrimination.***

24. **Of those legal actions involving against staff and schools for the treatment of children with a disability in NSW public schools in the last three years (2018, 2019 and 2020) where the department paid out settlements or discontinuations, involving complaints about staff, how many staff were removed from posts? *Legal actions made involve allegations originating from years before and my not be not just involve discrimination.***

25. **Of those legal actions involving against staff and schools for the treatment of children with a disability in NSW public schools in the last three years (2018, 2019 and 2020) where the department paid out settlements or discontinuations, involving complaints about staff, how many staff had no action taken against them? *Legal actions made involve allegations originating from years before and my not be not just involve discrimination.***

26. **How much money has the Government of NSW, on behalf of the NSW Department of Education, had to pay in court costs, in settlement and in discontinuation agreements in regard to legal action against staff and schools for the treatment of children with a disability in NSW public schools in the last three years (2018, 2019 and 20120)? *Legal actions made involve allegations originating from years before and my not be not just involve discrimination.***

Insurance and Care NSW (iCare) operates the Insurance for NSW self-insurance scheme and administers the NSW Treasury Managed Fund on behalf of NSW Government. It holds source data for NSW government agencies on legal claims.

As a result of the searches undertaken, the figures are as follows:

The above amounts were paid on behalf of the Department of Education in settlement of disability discrimination claims, as well as general negligence claims where the claimant had a pre-existing disability or where the fact of the child's disability was an essential component of the alleged breach of duty of care.

The above figures reflect the calendar year totals. Payments made during these calendar years may arise from events occurring during earlier periods.

\* The 2019 figure was previously reported as \$485,801. This was due to an administrative error in which a payment of \$15,000 was counted twice.

27. **Of those legal actions involving against staff and schools for the treatment of children with a disability in NSW public schools in the last three years (2018, 2019 and 2020) where the department paid out settlements or discontinuations, involving complaints about staff, thus ensuring no trial required how many of those did the Department request confidentiality agreements for? *Legal actions made involve allegations originating from years before and my not be not just involve discrimination.***

It is not possible to determine from data provided by iCare whether a confidentiality clause was requested by the Department of Education or by the claimant. It is normal for a legal settlement to be subject to a deed of release. Those deeds usually would contain a confidentiality clause to protect both parties. Confidentiality clauses protect confidential details of personal incidents that have occurred, without prejudice settlement negotiations, and settlement amounts. Frequently, confidentiality clauses are included at the request of claimants. In accordance with the model litigant policy, the Department does not insist on the inclusion of confidentiality clauses. The need for and content of such clauses are considered on a case by case basis.

28. **Why does the Department insist upon confidentiality agreements for settlements (in the above-mentioned cases) where the parties cannot talk about the case? *Legal actions made involve allegations originating from years before and my not be not just involve discrimination.***

The Department of Education does not insist on confidentiality clauses in all settlements. The Department complies with the Model Litigant policy in the conduct of litigation and considers the use of confidentiality clauses in relation to litigation settlements on a case by case basis.

29. **Does the Minister agree that by insisting upon confidentiality agreements and silencing alleged victims and their families that this can lead to a cover-up of abuse (as has been seen in other public institutions)?**

30. **How many primary mainstream schools in NSW have a separate ‘support unit’ for children with a disability?**

There are 445 mainstream primary schools with support classes for students with disability.

31. **How many secondary mainstream schools in NSW have a separate ‘support unit’ for children with a disability?**

There are 318 mainstream secondary and central schools with support classes for students with disability.

32. **How many NSW primary mainstream schools are fully inclusive for children with a disability (meaning children with a disability are equal, engaged members of a mainstream class not segregated by area or staff and there is no support unit/class specifically for children with a disability)?**

The Department of Education is committed to building a more inclusive education system. An education system where every student is known, valued and cared for and all students are learning to their fullest capability. The Inclusive Education Statement released in August 2020 marks the next stage of the Department’s work to further embed inclusive practice in NSW public schools. It is part of the commitment to the pursuit of excellence and the provision of high quality educational opportunities for every child, across all NSW public schools.

33. **How many NSW secondary mainstream schools are fully inclusive for children with a disability (meaning children with a disability are equal, engaged members of a mainstream class not segregated by area or staff and there is no support unit/class specifically for children with a disability)?**

The Department of Education is committed to building a more inclusive education system. An education system where every student is known, valued and cared for and all students are learning to their fullest capability. The Inclusive Education Statement released in August 2020 marks the next stage of the Department’s work to further embed inclusive practice in NSW public schools. It is part of the commitment to the pursuit of excellence and the provision of high quality educational opportunities for every child, across all NSW public schools.

**34. How many SSP schools have a full curriculum for children with a disability?**

In all schools, including SSPs, the NESA approved curriculum is followed. In SSPs the delivery is tailored to meet the individual needs of students with disability.

**35. The Department of Education has an Inclusion Policy, but when will the Department provide and publish an actual statement and definition of what Inclusion in schools is?**

The NSW Government publicly released an Inclusive Education Statement in August 2020. It can be found here: <https://education.nsw.gov.au/teaching-and-learning/disability-learning-and-support/our-disability-strategy/inclusive-education#Inclusive2>.

**36. How many children with a disability initially applied for enrolment in their local mainstream school in 2019/2020?**

All children initially enrol in their local mainstream school. The local school, in consultation with the parents, may then request additional specialist support if the student's support needs are significant or extensive.

**2019**

In 2019, 101,017 students initially enrolled into a NSW Public School for the first time.

There were approximately 10,170 students identified through Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability as requiring adjustments due to disability.

**2020**

In 2020, 92,735 students initially enrolled into a NSW Public School for the first time.

There were approximately 10,150 students identified through Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability as requiring adjustments due to disability.

**37. How many children with a disability, who initially applied for enrolment in a mainstream school in 2019/2020 were actually enrolled in a mainstream school as part of a mainstream class?**

**2019**

Based on data from the 2019 Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability, 7,795 students with adjustments to their learning because of disability who initially applied for enrolment in a mainstream school were actually enrolled in a mainstream school as part of a mainstream class.

**2020**

Based on data from the 2020 Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability, 8,144 students with adjustments to their learning because of

disability who initially applied for enrolment in a mainstream school were actually enrolled in a mainstream school as part of a mainstream class.

**38. How many children with a disability, who initially applied for enrolment in a mainstream school in 2019/2020 were actually enrolled in a mainstream school as part of a support class?**

All children who enrol in a NSW public school initially enrol in their local school. Parents may then apply for their child to be enrolled in a support class, some of which are in mainstream schools.

In 2019, 1,132 students who were initially enrolled into a mainstream school were fully enrolled into a support class in a mainstream school.

In 2020, 1,113 students who were initially enrolled into a mainstream school were fully enrolled into a support class in a mainstream school.

**39. How many children with a disability, who initially applied for enrolment in a mainstream school in 2019/2020 were actually enrolled in a SSP?**

All children who enrol in a NSW public school initially enrol in their local school. Parents may then apply for their child to be enrolled in a support class, some of which are SSPs.

In 2019, 1,249 students who were initially enrolled into a mainstream school were enrolled in an SSP.

In 2020, 897 students who were initially enrolled into a mainstream school were enrolled in an SSP.

**40. How many children with a disability, who have been in a SSP, have transferred to mainstream class in a mainstream school in 2019/20120?**

**41. Previously the Departments refused to allow children with a disability to move to distance education, who felt that schools were unsafe – with the department arguing it was not technically feasible, and this has led to increases in home schooling by an annual average of over 12% a year. Yet with COVID the Department could suddenly allow all students to work through distance/remote learning. Will the department now change its policy and allow children with a disability to choose distance learning as an option rather than being forced to home school due the Department creating perceived unsafe learning experiences for children with a disability.**

Distance education is provided as a safety-net provision when all other support provisions have been exhausted and the suitability of the home learning environment can be established.

There will be conditions where students with additional support needs meet the criteria for consideration of enrolment in distance education. In these circumstances, the usual enrolment procedures would apply. The enrolment procedures involve case management and assessment of the student's learning needs supported by the local Learning and Wellbeing staff through the Access Request process.

## **Home schooling**

### **42. To what degree does the Minister agree with the recommendations of the 'Measurement and outcome-based funding in New South Wales schools' Inquiry, particularly the recommendation "That the Department of Education require its schools to seek to conduct exit interviews of parents when students leave a school"?**

The NSW Government supported this recommendation in its initial response in August 2020 (ref: Recommendation 20).

The Principal Role Description describes the responsibilities of NSW public school principals, including consulting with parents and collaborating with the wider community on significant decisions.

Schools are expected to complete a student exit survey in the Department's enrolment and registration number (ERN) database, to collect information on each student's intended destination and reasons for leaving a school.

Principals are encouraged to meet with families who choose to leave a school to better understand that decision with an improvement lens. The Department welcomes families to share their experience either directly to schools, online via Feedback Assist, or in writing. Parents are also able to provide feedback across a number of survey opportunities and formats, including the Tell Them From Me Survey.

The Department is considering ways to strengthen this requirement and the use of this data without adding to the administrative burden of principals.

### **43. How many children have been registered for home schooling in 2020?**

As at 31 December 2020, there were 7,032 children registered for home schooling.

### **44. What percentage of these have been listed as choosing to do so because of** **a) Bullying** **b) Disability** **c) abuse**

Of the 80 per cent of parents who provided a reason for home schooling:

- (a) 0.15 per cent of parents identified bullying as the reason
- (b) 20.82 per cent of parents identified special learning needs as the reason.

NESA does not record 'abuse' as a category of reason for applying for home schooling registration.

**45. What funding if any, goes towards the education of children who are home schooled?**

The Department of Education does not receive any funding for the provision of home schooling.

The NSW Education Standards Authority is responsible for home schooling registration, as outlined in the *Guidelines for Home Schooling in NSW*.

Families electing to home school are responsible for meeting registration requirements, including in relation to resourcing.

**46. What happens to the funding that children did have, who then move to home schooling?**

Budget allocations to the Department of Education for government schooling are provided annually, according to variables such as student enrolments.

**47. Given the significant increases in children who are home schooled (significantly higher by percentage than public, Catholic or Independent enrolments) what is the Department doing to stem this tide away from the Department and is it recognising there are systemic failings for many children (especially those with a disability)?**

The Department remains committed to providing students with an education that best meets their individual needs and supports them with learning to their fullest capability. The importance of parental choice regarding the type of education provided to their child is also acknowledged.

Students may be eligible for specialist services, including support classes and specialist support staff. A local panel assesses access to these services after the local school submits an Access Request application.

Distance education is provided as a safety-net provision when all other support provisions have been exhausted and the suitability of the home learning environment can be established.

The Disability Strategy is working to improve outcomes for students with disability in every public school across NSW. In 2020, the Department implemented key Disability Strategy initiatives, and has now delivered more than two-thirds of the immediate focus areas.

Important achievements in 2020 include:

- The release of the Inclusive Education Statement for students with disability with six principles of inclusive practice to continue to strengthen inclusion in every public school.

- 160 teachers received an Inclusive Practice in Education scholarship to enrol in a master's degree in inclusive/special education, growing the number of teachers with this expertise.
- All school leaders must now complete Disability Standards for Education training. This ensures staff understand their legal obligations to make sure students with a disability can access and participate in education on the same basis as students without disability.
- 16 successful Innovation Program trials involving 30 government schools and two preschools are trialling innovative approaches to improve the learning and wellbeing of students with disability.
- Families and carers can now access a new online hub to make it easier for them to find the advice and information they need to support their child through their education journey.

### **Performance and Accountability**

- 48. To what degree does the Minister agree with the recommendations of the 'Measurement and outcome-based funding in New South Wales schools' Inquiry, particularly the recommendation "hat the Government place school principals on performance-based contracts with significantly increased salaries. Performance measures should be based on the effective use of evidence and data, and achievement of high-level school results (measured primarily by value adding)"?**

The NSW Government noted this recommendation in its initial response in August 2020 (ref: Recommendation 25).

As set out in the Government's response to the inquiry, this would represent a significant departure from historical and statutory employment practices and would require extensive consultation with stakeholders and further consideration by NSW Government. The NSW Government is working to further enhance principal performance. The School Leadership Institute has developed a draft Principal Leadership Framework to support the professional growth of principals. The Principal Leadership Framework sets out the leadership actions and behaviours that research indicates have a positive impact on teacher and student learning.

- 49. To what degree does the Minister agree with the recommendations of the 'Measurement and outcome-based funding in New South Wales schools' Inquiry, particularly the recommendation "hat the Government place Directors of Educational Leadership (DELs) on performance-based contracts, using the combined achievements of their local cluster of 20 schools (measured primarily by value adding) as the main assessment criteria for whether or not to extend their contracts"?**

The NSW Government supported this recommendation in its initial response in August 2020 (ref: Recommendation 26).

As set out in the Government's response to the inquiry, Directors of Educational Leadership (DELs) are employed on performance-based contracts as part of the Public Service Senior Executive (PSSE) structure, with Performance Agreements that reflect key performance indicators.

DELs are accountable for providing leadership and direction to principals, ensuring high standards of student progress and achievement. This will be demonstrated through the schools in their principal networks improving student outcomes and achieving their targets (including expected student growth) set under the School Success Model.

The School Success Model also outlines the support that schools will receive from the Department to achieve their targets. Just as there are targets for schools and DELs to achieve, there will be ambitious targets for all PSSE officers to reduce administrative burden and provide evidence-based support, guidance and direction to lift school and student performance.

50. **To what degree does the Minister agree with the recommendations of the ‘Measurement and outcome-based funding in New South Wales schools’ Inquiry, particularly the recommendation “that the Government place Directors of Educational Leadership (DELs) on performance-based contracts, using the combined achievements of their local cluster of 20 schools (measured primarily by value adding) as the main assessment criteria for whether or not to extend their contracts”?**

See answer to question 49.

51. **To what degree does the Minister agree with the recommendations of the ‘Measurement and outcome-based funding in New South Wales schools’ Inquiry, particularly the recommendation “That the Minister for Education give greater priority to developing performance measures, targets and accountability in disability education and commission CESE to identify best practice, working with experts”?**

The NSW Government supported this recommendation in its initial response in August 2020 (ref: Recommendation 22).

As set out in the Government’s response to the inquiry, the commitment to strengthen disability education performance measures was part of the Disability Strategy launched in 2018, and CESE is continuing this work by drawing upon international evidence on appropriate and inclusive methods for measuring student progress.

Research has been commissioned on best practice, and CESE released case studies and a supporting discussion guide on inclusive education in July 2020.

The Department of Education is working with its partners to develop and implement an outcomes measurement system for students with disability. The framework will include high level domains and outcomes, and support the development of measures, baseline data and targets in 2022.

These measures will form part of the suite of targets under the School Success Model. The School Success Model builds on ambitious performance targets developed in partnership between individual schools and the Department. Targets

are set for individual schools as well as system leaders to share responsibility for student success. School Success Model targets reflect the context of each school but also include consistent indicators of student achievement that apply to all students across the state – including for students with a disability - including literacy, numeracy, HSC attainment, student growth, and attendance.

52. **The ‘NSW Ombudsman Inquiry into behaviour management in schools’ that was tabled to the 2017 Parliamentary Inquiry into Students with a disability or special needs in New South Wales schools recommended “*The department should form a reference group, including key advocates, parent/carer representatives, and other stakeholders, to: look at complaints work from a structural, systems perspective (not dealing with individual matters), and inform the review of the interagency models (see recommendations 19 and 20 above).*” Other than the Disability Strategy Reference Group does the Department still only investigate itself (though EPAC) with no transparent accountability?**

The Department has established a Feedback and Complaints Team which examines complaints data and works closely with the Disability Strategy team to use that data to inform improvements.

The review of the Professional and Ethical Standards Directorate (formerly the Employee Performance and Conduct Directorate) conducted by Mr Mark Tedeschi AM QC, in 2019, confirmed the importance of the Department’s investigative function.

Under the *Children’s Guardian Act 2019*, the Department is a relevant entity in NSW, required to report allegations where it has been alleged that an employee has physically, sexually, psychologically or emotionally harmed or neglected a child or young person and investigate those allegations. The Office of the Children’s Guardian oversees the Department’s actions, monitors and guides the progress of investigations and assesses whether the Department’s investigation was fair, transparent, effective and timely. This system provides strong external scrutiny of the Department’s investigations.

53. **What (if any) outcomes have come from the internal EPAC review?**

All 60 recommendations made by Mr Mark Tedeschi AM QC in his review of the Employee Performance and Conduct Directorate (now the Professional and Ethical Standards Directorate [PES]) were accepted or accepted in principle.

Of the recommendations, 58 have already been implemented.

Key outcomes from the implementation of the recommendations include:

- The allocation of \$2.7million to increase PES’ staffing. All new investigator and specialist staff were recruited and trained by February 2020. This has led to:
  - A reduction in investigator caseloads to 11 at the end of 2020 down from 25-30 in 2019.
  - 80 per cent of matters being closed in less than 12 months as compared to 67 per cent in 2019 and 62 per cent in 2018.

- The embedding of a preliminary investigation team to gather early information and provide practical support to principals/workplace managers on managing conduct concerns.
- The development of a case rating system to identify and bench mark short, medium and complex investigations.
- The establishment of a disciplinary advisory panel to advise on disciplinary outcomes for career defining disciplinary action.
- Revised Guidelines for the Management of Conduct and Performance and supporting documentation making provision for
  - more detailed notifications accommodating early submission and witness nominations by employees under investigation
  - timely updates to all parties
  - a process to re-consider employees placement on alternative duties or suspension.
- Publication of new resources including:
  - PES disciplinary decisions on the staff intranet
  - Bulletins to support workplace managers and parties to an investigation on topical issues
  - tools to assist principals/workplace managers in making professional judgment in defining misconduct, reporting matters for investigation and directly managing conduct issues in the workplace.

**54. Does the Minister believe that education should have independent accountability or is the Minister satisfied that the Department of Education should investigate itself (such as with EPAC) with no accountability and no public trust (similar to the Catholic Church investigating itself over child abuse allegations)?**

The review of the Professional and Ethical Standards Directorate (formerly the Employee Performance and Conduct Directorate) conducted in 2019 by Mr Mark Tedeschi AM QC, confirmed the importance of the Department's investigative function.

The NSW reportable conduct scheme, established in 2000, provides a robust framework for the investigation of allegations that employees have harmed a child or young person. In 2017, the Final Report of the Royal Commission into the responses of institutions to child sexual abuse recognised the strength of the reportable conduct system in NSW and recommended that States and Territories implement systems that would mirror the NSW system.

The *Children's Guardian Act 2019*, requires the Department of Education to report all allegations of reportable conduct to the Office of the Children's Guardian within 24 hours, to manage risk to students and to investigate those allegations. The investigations are then oversighted by the Office of the Children's Guardian. This system provides strong external scrutiny of the Department's investigations.

The Department is also required to report allegations of corrupt conduct to the NSW Independent Commission against Corruption (ICAC). Following assessment and advice from the ICAC, the Department investigates allegations of corrupt conduct against employees.

**55. How many staff (and percentage of total staff) have undertaken face-to-face disability training?**

From July 2019 to 30 June 2020 there were 26,180 course completions by school staff across all Disability Standards for Education eLearning courses.

The Department also offers eight online blended learning courses to staff which cover specific topics related to disability. These courses are delivered as a combination of self-guided e-learning and tutor-led small group sessions. From July 2019 to 30 June 2020 there were 3,189 (3.13 per cent) course completions recorded for school staff across the eight courses.

As part of the pilot for the course, Trauma-informed Practice for Improved Learning and Wellbeing, 1,565 staff members (1.54 per cent) completed face-to-face training. This course is being rolled out across the State in 2021.

**56. How many Principals (and percentage of total staff) have undertaken face-to-face disability training?**

In July 2020, Disability Standards for Education Leaders eLearning was mandated for staff who are substantive, acting or relieving in leadership positions. As of 1 March 2021, 92 per cent of school leaders have already completed this training.

**57. How many principals (and percentage of total staff) have undertaken face-to-face training in legal requirements for child protection and abuse allegation?**

Child protection training is mandatory for all Department employees, including principals, and is provided in two online training modules:

- Child Protection Awareness Training, introduced in 2015, this is to be completed once by all new employees.
- A Mandatory Child Protection Update, that is to be completed by all staff annually.

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**Garside Road site**

- 58. Regarding the statement by Mr Manning (see Hansard p74, last para) that the Garside Road site “was identified as surplus to requirement some years ago”:**

The site at 98 Garside Road Mollymook was identified as surplus to requirements in 2018. In line with NSW Treasury guidelines, the site was first offered to all other NSW

agencies. In September 2020, as none expressed an interest in acquiring the site, it was subsequently offered for sale on the open market. Following a substantial number of community representations in early 2021 the NSW Government decided not to proceed to auction of the land at this stage. The Department will consult with the local community regarding the use of the site.

- 59. How much has been spent on the halted sale of Garside Road broken into the following?**

Total costs incurred to date on the proposed sale of 98 Garside Road, Mollymook are approximately \$17,000, excluding GST. It is noted that the Department incurs annual costs of \$10,000 - \$20,000 to maintain the site, including on Asset Protection Zone fuel reduction and tree maintenance.

- (a) The Department of Education uses a number of methodologies and data sets in planning for new schools and upgrades. These are regularly updated but are not available publicly as they inform investment decisions not yet made by Government.
- (b)
- i The Department uses two types of projections – school enrolment and student intake area – to inform short and medium term school planning. These projections are updated annually at a minimum and more regularly when there is new, relevant input data available. The latest student intake area projections, for example, were updated in March 2021.
  - ii The Department conducted the student intake area projection review.
  - iii Student intake area projections determine the number of students likely to live in a government school catchment over the next 15 years. The Department uses the NSW Common Planning Assumptions, as a basis for these projections. The common planning assumptions are provided by the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE), and are used by all Government agencies to ensure consistent planning across NSW. The Department then allocates estimated student numbers

across school intake areas using a number of data sources outlined in (b) v below.

- iv It was a statewide review of student by area projections.
- v The Department considers a range of data sources to inform projections, including the DPIE Common Planning Assumptions, the Sydney Housing Supply Forecast (also from DPIE), Department of Education enrolment data and Australian Census data.
- vi The Department produces student intake area projections for all NSW government schools, year on year for the next 15 years. These projections are used to provide guidance on the number of students forecast to be living within a school catchment over the longer term and help guide school infrastructure provision in metropolitan, regional and rural NSW.

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### COVID impact support

66. **NCOSS's Wave of Disadvantage report estimates that mean NAPLAN scores in Year 9 maths will fall by 23.6 points in 2021 due to COVID-19, with some parts of NSW falling by up to 45.5 points. The 2020-21 Budget committed \$337 million for an additional 5,500 staff to deliver small-group teaching at public schools and non-government schools with high need.**
- (a) **Has there been an increase in children and young people disengaging from the education system due to COVID-19? What do 2021 enrolment figures tell us in this regard?**
  - (b) **What is the NSW Government doing to support disengaged students and invest in alternative education pathways?**
  - (c) **How many students are taking up the extra tutoring support that was announced in last year's budget?**
  - (d) **How many additional tutoring jobs have been created as a result?**

- a) The enrolment figures collected from schools contain only the total number of students per grade for each school. These figures do not detail why students enrol or dis-enrol in a school.
- b) Attendance support officers, including Aboriginal Student Liaison Officers and Home School Liaison Officers, work with schools and their students, families and communities, to promote attendance and support disengaged students to re-engage with school.

Transition Advisers are high school teachers who are trained to work with disengaged students. Their work complements the role of the Careers Adviser. Alternative education pathways include:

- Distance Education is available for students from preschool to Year 12, on a continuing basis or as a temporary provision, for students who are geographically isolated or whose individual circumstances prevent them from regularly attending school. Principals must use the Distance Education Enrolment Procedures to determine a student's eligibility to enrol in a distance education program. Disengagement may be a contributing factor when considering a distance education pathway for a student with complex health or behaviour needs to support re-engagement with learning.
- Vocational Education and Training (VET) is a fully integrated component of curriculum in NSW. All VET curriculum is developed or endorsed by the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) for inclusion in both the Record of School Achievement in Stage 5 or HSC in Stage 6. Students of all ability levels and interests can undertake VET courses from Year 9. Students gain knowledge and skills in a specific industry area, as well as work toward a nationally recognised qualification.

VET curriculum provides students with hands-on learning and skill development through significant practical learning which appeals to young people that may be disengaged with the more theoretical subjects. A new initiative to connect theoretical with practical application of learning is the Maths in Trades learning resources, developed by the Apprenticeship Engagement Forum to support the delivery of Stage 5 Mathematics curriculum. Further information is available on the Apprenticeship Engagement Forum's website at <https://apprenticeshipengagementforum.com.au/Pages/MathsInTrades.aspx>

- The *NSW Education Act 1990* recognises that a parent may choose home schooling registration as a legitimate way of providing for the compulsory schooling of children in NSW. The requirements and process for home schooling registration are described in NESA's Guidelines for Home Schooling Registration in NSW.
- c) The COVID Intensive Learning Support Program provides targeted support to around one quarter of students (290,000), from government and non-government schools (primary, high school and schools for specific

purposes) who are in most need of a learning boost after the disruptions of 2020.

- d) As of 1 March 2021, schools reported that 3,968 staff had been employed for the COVID Intensive Learning Support Program.

### **Behaviour Strategy**

Service Need Reports are developed to inform NSW Government investment decisions and therefore the Department of Education does not disclose these reports.

- 73. Can you please provide an updated spreadsheet list of all the Cooler Classrooms school projects, broken down by their current project phase and including their completion date or estimated completion date?**

The NSW Government’s Cooler Classrooms Program is a five year, \$500 million commitment to provide cooling, heating and fresh air ventilation systems in more than 900 NSW public schools.

As at 28 February 2021:

- 333 schools are complete
- 480 schools are in progress
- 105 have not started or on hold.

- 74. When will the successful Cooler Classrooms Round 2 schools be announced?**

The rollout of the five-year, \$500 million Cooler Classrooms Program to schools with a mean maximum temperature above 30 degrees, and successful applications in Round 1 has informed the assessment of Round 2 applications.

A due diligence process has been completed and successful schools will be notified in due course.

- 75. Will all the Round 1 and 2 school Cooler Classroom projects be completed within the announced project timeframe?**

Approved projects will be completed within the timeframe.

- 76. What are the lessons that have been learnt from the first round of Cooler Classrooms funding?**

Lessons learned are a feature of any good program management framework and inform the planning, delivery and commissioning stages of all cooler classrooms projects.

The timeframe for installation of air conditioning is different at each school due to a range of factors such as defining the scope of works, heritage considerations and the electrical capacity at the school.

Capacity limitations in the market mean that forward planning the Program at least 12- 24 months in advance is critical to maximising the utilisation of limited resources.

**77. How many unflued gas heaters have been removed as part of the Cooler Classrooms program? Please provide a list broken down by school.**

To date the Cooler Classrooms Program has seen the removal of 2,375 unflued gas heaters.

### **Temporary/Insecure Employment**

**92. Recent Department of Education statistics show that extremely large numbers of school support staff remain in temporary positions. For example, the figures show that approximately 64.3% of School Learning Support Officers (SLSOs) were employed on a temporary basis, this is up from 61.57% in 2017. This equates to over 9 thousand employees 86.38% of which are women and many have been employed on a temporary basis for over 10 years (some up to 20 years).**

- (a) How is this acceptable when the employer is government?**

The allocation of permanent SLSO entitlement is based on the notional enrolment of students with additional support needs. In addition, principals can and do create additional temporary or permanent SLSO roles using other flexible and program funding to meet additional school and student needs.

The predominance of women in the SASS workforce, inclusive of SLSOs, was addressed in Public Service Association's pay equity application which led to the Industrial Relations Commission making a new three-year Award for NSW School Administrative and Support (SAS) Staff on 13 September 2019, inclusive of an immediate 11% pay increase, with subsequent increases under the award consistent with the NSW Government Wages Policy.

- 93. Many SLSOs are employed with funding attached to the student. The argument for temporary employment is that a student could leave the school and the funding would go with them leaving the school or the department out of pocket. However, the number of students with a disability in Public Schools has not decreased in the last 15 years and there is no reason to expect it is likely to.**

**(a) Therefore, how can this lack of permanent employment be justified?**

Principals can and do make decisions in relation to the use of program and/or flexible school funding to create and employ temporary roles to support specific students, or they can also create these as permanent roles if this meets the needs of the school and is supported by ongoing funding.

There is also a mechanism available for eligible long term temporary School Administrative and Support Staff employees to be transitioned to permanent employment where a permanent vacancy exists or is created with additional funding.

### **Disability Enrolments**

Data regarding the number of students receiving adjustments for disability is collected in August each year through the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability. Data is not yet available for 2021.

As at March 2021, 5,526 students with disability were enrolled in support classes in Schools for Specific Purposes (SSPs).

The Department is committed to meeting the needs of all current and future students and providing a high-quality education for every child, across all of NSW public schools.

- 97. What is the Government's projection for numbers of students with disability that will be enrolled in SSPs schools over the next 10 years?**

The Department is committed to meeting the needs of all current and future students and providing a high-quality education for every child, across all of NSW public schools.

## **Violence**

### **98. How many violent incidents have been logged with the Department of Education's incident hotline from schools over the last 12 months?**

From 11 March 2020 to 10 March 2021 there have been 11,587 incidents reported to the Department of Education's incident hotline that relate to the category of 'violence'.

The category of violence includes incidents categorised as assault, threat/intimidation, allegation of sexual assault, indecent assault, accidental assault and anti-social and extremist behaviour.

### **99. How many violent incidents have been logged with the Department of Education's incident hotline from SLSOs over the last 12 months?**

When an incident is notified to the Department of Education's incident hotline, the position of the person lodging the report is not recorded against the incident at that time.

## **Nurses – mental health – removal of Registered Nurse at Sir Eric Woodward School**

### **100. Will the Government commit to the provision of an RN at Sir Eric Woodward School and other Schools for Specific Purposes where there are students with high physical support needs?**

The provision of a Registered Nurse in NSW public schools, including Sir Eric Woodward School, is based upon the individual health support needs of a student.

The health care needs of the vast majority of students can be met within the scope of duties of student learning support officers. If a student requires health supports outside their scope the Department provides these supports for students.

### **101. What is the implementation strategy for the 100 nurses? (a) When is it due to be rolled out/completed?**

The NSW Government has committed \$46.8 million over four years as part of the 2020-21 NSW Budget to deliver 100 new school-based nurses to support the health and wellbeing needs of students and their families.

NSW Health is leading the rollout. They are employing 100 Wellbeing In-Reach Nurses (WHINs) to work from NSW public schools.

Implementation has been arranged into 2 tranches:

- Tranche 1: 50 WHINs rollout, in Term 1, 2021,
- Tranche 2: 50 WHINs rollout, in Term 2, 2021.

NSW Health anticipates 100 WHINs rollout will be completed in 2021.

**102. How will they interact with mental health supports already being implemented in schools such as School Psychologists, Student Support Officers and School Learning Support Officers?**

The Wellbeing In-Reach Nurses (WHINs) Coordinator will work as part of the school's Learning and Support Team, alongside school teachers and the school counsellor, school psychologists, Student Support Officers and School Learning Support Officers. Each role is clearly defined and communicated to schools through an extensive induction and support program.

**WHIN Coordinators**

- Collaborate with Learning and Support Teams to enhance whole of family early identification, planning and referral to Health, Youth and Community services
- Support Local Health Districts in identifying emerging health issues within a school community
- Support health student referral processes
- Facilitate collaboration between Department of Education and NSW Health.

**School Counselling Service**

- Support students by providing psychological counselling, assessment and intervention
- Evidence-based interventions with students individually or in small groups including counselling and mental health support
- Assessment and support for learning difficulties
- Providing psychological advice to individual students and schools to support wellbeing initiatives and programs
- Clinical liaison with NSW Health and other mental health organisations to support students and families.

The WHIN will work with other roles as required and identified through the Learning and Support Team.

**103. Does the Government have a wellbeing strategy for students in public schools to ensure any money spent is effective and addresses youth mental health and the added impacts of COVID-19?**

The NSW Government has an extensive range of wellbeing strategies to effectively support youth mental health and the impacts of emergencies, natural disasters, and the COVID-19 pandemic.

These strategies include a significant expansion in dedicated wellbeing and mental health positions in schools through increased School Counselling positions, Student Support Officers and Wellbeing Health In-reach Nurse Coordinators.

The Department of Education has undertaken significant planning and research to identify and deliver cost-effective, evidence-based programs for students and evidence-informed training for teachers.

The Department is partnering with leading national and international mental health agencies to support schools to deliver best practice in prevention and early intervention mental health support. Partners include the NSW Health, PAXIS Institute, Black Dog Institute, headspace, batyr, Centre for Emotional Health, Macquarie University, Project Air Strategy for Schools, and the University of Wollongong.

Through these partnerships, the Department is delivering evidence-based programs for students and building the mental health literacy of teachers to recognise and respond to children and young people with mental health problems. Examples of evidence-based universal prevention programs for students being delivered include PAX Good Behaviour Game and Youth Aware of Mental Health.

The Department has also established a mental health and wellbeing hub for students, teachers and parents. This hub is a single-entry point to resources, information, tools, and programs to support students' mental health and well-being. More information on the hub can be found at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/student-wellbeing/counselling-and-psychology-services>.

### **Murwillumbah Schools Amalgamation**

#### **104. Will the government halt the decision and enter into genuine consultation with the community as to the building of this mega school and the impact this will have in the community?**

Consultation with stakeholders and the community is a key aspect of the development of the Murwillumbah Education Campus and will continue to be so. This is the case with all school infrastructure projects.

Community consultation on the project has involved the Parents and Citizens Associations, the Principals and Directors of Educational Leadership. The Department of Education has also received feedback from its community information sessions and correspondence it receives from the community.

The Department scheduled a Community Information Hub to open from 23 March 2021 to 1 April 2021. Due to recent flood events, the Hub has been rescheduled and will commence from Monday, 29 March.

There will be no permanent job losses as a result of the amalgamation of schools at Murwillumbah.

The Department of Education has proposed to maintain staffing at a minimum of 2021 entitlement across the Murwillumbah schools involved in the amalgamation for a period of five years inclusive. In the instance where a permanent staff member is in excess of the entitlement, they will be managed using normal processes.

There are already processes in place for principals to offer eligible temporary teachers or school administrative and support staff (SASS) a permanent role. This depends on the teacher or SASS officers’ eligibility, the availability of a permanent vacancy and the needs of the school.

No decision has been made regarding the existing school sites. Any decision will be determined in consultation with the local community.

### **Teachers, workload and curriculum**

#### **158. How is the Government responding to the findings of the Gallop report investigation that there is a crisis in teaching with unsustainable workloads, salaries that have not kept pace with other professions and teachers feeling overwhelmed by the constant pace of policy change?**

Teachers hold one of the most crucial positions in society. They play a vital role in communities and are among the most critical in-school determinants of student outcomes.

The matters raised in by the Geoff Gallop Report are existing issues that are being addressed through a range of reforms announced by the NSW Government.

The NSW Government is working with teachers closely on these reforms to ensure that school time is focused on what matters most – leading, teaching and supporting students.

#### **159. The report found that the release time that primary teachers have hasn't changed since 1984. How do you justify that given the incredible increase in the workload of teachers since that time and secondary in 70 years?**

The nominal “standard” operating hours for school are 9.30am to 3.30pm for primary schools. Within these operating hours, a primary school teacher is required to teach face to face for 4 hours and 45 minutes each day. Over a week this equates to 21 hours and 45 minutes face to face teaching time for a fulltime teacher. In primary schools, full time teachers are entitled to two hours a week of release from face to face teaching.

In 1997, the Department of Education implemented three, student-free, School Development (SD) Days a year to support teachers and schools with planning, organisational, administrative, induction and staff development matters. These days occur on the first day of Terms 1, 2 and 3. In 2009, two additional SD Days were introduced on the last two days of Term 4 (with capacity to move to other times of the year as needed) to support professional learning for teachers.

In addition to standard release provision, the Department funds targeted release for teachers to support specific objectives. An example of this is the release provided for beginning teachers and their mentors, which commenced in 2014. Eligible teachers are teachers appointed permanently or temporarily for 12 months as a classroom teacher (not teaching or non-teaching executives or principals) who require mandatory accreditation and have not yet achieved Proficient Teacher accreditation at their date of entering on duty. First year funding is equivalent to two hours per week release time for the beginning teacher and an additional one hour per week release time for an expert teacher to provide practice-based mentoring support.

Second year funding is equivalent to one hour per week release time for the beginning teacher.

In addition to this, the NSW Government has recently set a new target as part of the School Success Model to reduce the administrative workload of teachers by 20 per cent.

**160. Do you personally think 2 hours a week is enough for lesson planning, professional development, collaborating with colleagues, dealing with student welfare issues, communicating with parents and implementing a new curriculum?**

The nominal "standard" operating hours for school are 9.30am to 3.30pm for primary schools and 9.00am to 3.30pm for high schools.

Primary school teachers receive two hours a week release from face time, and are required to teach face to face for the equivalent of 21 hours and 45 minutes per week for a fulltime teacher.

High school teachers' allocation of face to face teaching equates to 20 hours and 40 minutes per week teaching time. This is set out in Clause 16 Allocation of Duties in High Schools in the school teachers award. A 'period' in a high or central school is defined in the award as a 40 minute teaching period. Teachers are required to teach for 28 periods per week plus up to three periods per week for sport.

Schools also receive funding to provide additional release time for permanent and temporary beginning teachers in their first year of service equivalent to two hours per week, and one hour per week release time for an experienced teacher to provide practice-based mentoring support. This is extended in the second year for permanent teachers, with funding equivalent to one hour per week release time for the beginning teacher.

In addition to this, the NSW Government has recently set a new target as part of the School Success Model to reduce the administrative workload of teachers by 20 per cent.

**161. Do you think teachers in NSW public schools are doing a great job?**

Yes.

**162. Do you support teachers receiving a pay rise capped at 0.3% in 2022 and 1.5% in subsequent years? Is that all they deserve?**

Salary increases for teachers and related employees are covered by the *Crown Employees (Teachers in Schools and Related Employees) Salaries and Conditions Award 2020* (the teachers award) which expires on 31 December 2021. Under the current award, teachers and related employees were paid:

- a 2.5 per cent salary increase in the first pay period from 1 January 2020; and
- a further 2.28 per cent salary increase from 1 January 2021.

The Federal Government's increase in the Superannuation Guarantee Charge (SGC) of 0.5 per cent from July 2021 has been taken into account as part of the salary increase paid from January 2021.

Over the life of the current award, teachers have received increases in remuneration of 2.5 per cent per annum.

In November 2020, the NSW Government announced that public sector wage increases would be capped at 1.5 per cent in line with inflation forecasts. The current teachers award expires on 31 December 2021. Negotiations with the NSW Teachers Federation for a new teacher's award are due to commence in October 2021. The Department of Education is required to conduct award negotiations in accordance with the NSW Government wages policy.

**163. Can you explain how this one size fits all wages cap will help fix the shortages you have identified and help recruit the thousands of additional teachers required to deal with record enrolment growth over the next two decades?**

The NSW Department of Education values quality teaching and remunerates its staff to reflect this.

In November 2020, the NSW Government announced that public sector wage increases would be capped at 1.5 per cent in line with inflation forecasts. The current teachers award expires on 31 December 2021. Negotiations with the NSW Teachers Federation for a new teacher's award are due to commence in October 2021. The Department is required to conduct award negotiations in accordance with the NSW Government wages policy.

Boosting the supply of quality teachers is a priority for the Department.

The Department continues to refine and improve its strategies to meet the needs of school communities, to ensure NSW public schools are staffed by quality teachers.

The Department is developing a strategy to ensure a sustainable supply of quality teachers over the next ten years.

**164. Early last year the Minister said teacher shortages were a problem across the state and it was keeping you up at night. But recently the Minister said having more than 1,200 teacher positions vacant in NSW public schools was "not something I am overly concerned about". How can you be unconcerned about 1200 vacant positions?**

Permanent teacher vacancies can occur at any time throughout the year for a range of reasons. These can include transfer to another school, promotion to a higher level position, retirement or resignation.

The current number of permanent teacher vacancies represents less than 2 per cent of the total permanent teacher workforce. Once a vacancy is declared, the Department of Education's School Recruitment and Placement team work closely with the Principal to ascertain how the vacancy will be filled, which can be via a

central appointment method or a local choice option, including an open merit selection process. In nearly all cases, at any point in time, action is being taken to fill a declared vacancy with a permanent teacher.

- 165. Can you explain why in table 1.2 of Budget Paper No. 3 the capital budget for education and skills is cut from \$3.053b in 20-21 to \$1.214b in 2022-23 and then to \$626 billion in 2023-24?**

The capital budget for education and skills is allocated on a rolling annual basis, according to the projects announced by Government at each State Budget.

The pattern of budget allocations for 2020-21 and forward years is consistent with past Budget Papers.

- 166. 17 out of 24 recommendations (over 70%) of the Masters curriculum review were supported by the government, with many others noted with further advice from NESA required. Did you make the decision to truncate the timeline from 6 years to 4 for implementation recommended by Masters' Curriculum Review and on what basis?**

Given the significant benefits of the reforms for students, the NSW Government has indicated priority reforms for implementation in a timeframe of four years.

- 167. The normal timeline for implementation in schools of new syllabuses is 2 years, time for consultation and feedback from teachers, a period of refinement thereafter, trialling in schools, processes of familiarization for parents, time for teachers to develop/design new programs reflecting the changes, professional learning on the new syllabuses etc. Which of these things should not occur given the proposed shortening of the timeline and the new K – 2 English and Math syllabuses will be taught in schools in 2022? Can you outline how this is in the best interests of students and improves outcomes for them?**

The draft K-2 English and Maths curriculum has already been released for consultation. As per the Government's commitment, the syllabuses will roll out in 2022 with mandatory implementation from 2023 which is consistent with the usual two year process. Previous K-10 consultation periods have followed a similar timeframe. During 2022, teachers and sectors will have the opportunity to trial each syllabus in their local school context and engage with necessary professional learning. NESA will collaborate with the sectors during the roll-out period to provide support for teachers and release further support materials during this time.

We know that this is ambitious reform. NESA will continue working closely with the education sectors and other key stakeholders to ensure that teachers are supported to implement changes to the curriculum. We know removing clutter and reducing paperwork will give teachers more time to focus on teaching and learning.

- 168. In an opinion piece on 31 August last year in *The Australian*, Minister you said "For too long the debate around diagnostic testing has been hampered by NAPLAN's obvious flaws... And we must accept NAPLAN — now 12 years old — is considerably out of date and no longer up to the task." Given this, why is**

**your School Success Model underpinned by systems targets in 2021 for improvement for schools and their students' outcomes based on NAPLAN bands?**

Under the School Success Model, NAPLAN is only one of the sources of data used to measure school improvement. Other measures include literacy, numeracy, HSC attainment, student growth, and attendance, which are measured through a variety of data sources held centrally by the Department. Additional targets reflecting a broader range of school performance indicators will be developed during the implementation of the School Success Model including destination pathways and student engagement.

The methodology used to inform the School Success Model does not include NAPLAN writing data, which was identified by the Final Report of the NSW/VIC/QLD/ACT NAPLAN Review ('the Review') as requiring redevelopment. The Review, released in August 2020, affirmed the value of standardised testing and identified several recommendations to improve the assessment program after more than ten years of operation.

We will continue to work with the Commonwealth and other states and territories to improve NAPLAN to be the most useful tool it can be and the methodology used to inform the school success model will be revised if required.

**169. What measures has the Department put in place for teachers to reduce the administrative burden and provide more time for teachers to implement new syllabuses from next year as a result of what is described by government, as the most 'significant curriculum reform in 30 years'?**

The Department of Education has a program of work to reduce the administrative burden on schools which has delivered a number of improvements for teachers over the last three years.

The program includes embedding a school-centric delivery approach across the Department, ensuring solutions that the Department rolls out meet school needs, are coordinated across the Department, and avoid unnecessary duplication or effort.

To date, the reducing the administrative burden program has saved an estimated 1 million hours across the system, i.e., approximately 500 hours for schools broken down to 105 hours for principals, 10 hours for teachers, and 25 hours for administration staff per year.

This year, there will be a strengthened focus on reducing administrative burden for schools as highlighted within the recently announced School Success Model.

Ambitious targets will be in place to reduce the red tape for principals and teachers by 20 per cent. In phase 2 of the model in 2022, administrative burden will be further reduced by simplifying the school budget and improving system wide reporting.

## **New curriculum**

### **170. What is the budget allocated to support the implementation of the new curriculum by the Department of education in public schools?**

Delivering the curriculum is at the core of NSW education and teachers are well equipped to deliver the new syllabuses. Schools in NSW are receiving record amounts of needs-based funding with recurrent increases locked in until 2027.

Additional professional learning will be provided to schools, along with resources to support program and lesson plan development.

### **171. What is the budget allocated to support the implementation of the new curriculum in non-government schools?**

#### **(a) What is the breakdown of this and in what areas and how will that budget deliver support for schools and teachers in the implementation?**

Non-government schools in NSW are allocated funding on a sector-wide basis and are able to spend that funding as they see fit to support teaching and learning.

## **Staffing**

### **172. Does the Government and/or the department have a responsibility to ensure that a qualified teacher is in front of every class?**

Teachers in NSW public schools are required to hold qualifications consistent with the requirements of the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) and the provisions of the *Crown Employees (Teachers in Schools and Related Employees) Salaries and Conditions Award 2017*.

### **173. Is it the position of the government/department that a qualified teacher ought not teach outside of the area for which they are specialized?**

Teachers are appointed to a permanent position on the basis of their qualifications and the needs of the school at that time. Once appointed, principals make local decisions in regards to the allocation of resources, based on the qualifications, skills and capabilities of their teachers and the curriculum needs of the school.

### **174. Is it a good use of a principal's time trying to find teachers to staff their schools? Isn't that the role of the Department?**

NSW public schools are permanently staffed on the basis of relevant industrial arrangements and Awards.

In the case of teachers, permanent staffing is managed in accordance with a Staffing Agreement between the Department and the NSW Teachers Federation. Within this agreement, positions are filled on a permanent basis through a mix of centralised appointments (including transfers) and local choice options, which can include an open merit selection process.

In all cases, principals are supported by the Department's School Recruitment and Placement function to fill vacancies. In addition, the Department's JobFeed publication advertises permanent and temporary teaching opportunities to over 70,000 subscribers each week. Principals are not required to source their own teaching staff, although there is nothing precluding a principal from promoting temporary teaching opportunities, or any advertised permanent position through local channels.

### **School maintenance**

**175. The government provided a response to the Hon Courtney Houssos on 9 February 2021 stating that the maintenance backlog for NSW public schools as at 14 January 2021 sits at zero. What is it now that we are half way through Term 1?**

**(a) Can you provide a breakdown of the total list with the dollar amount of maintenance by school?**

The maintenance backlog for NSW public schools is zero.

### **Public preschools**

**176. How many new public preschools will be built in 2020-2021?**

The Start Strong Capital Works Grants Program aims to increase the number of community preschool places available for children in the two years before school by assisting new and existing community preschools to build, renovate or extend their facilities to cater for increasing enrolments across the state.

Since 2013, more than \$90 million has been allocated for Capital Works to create additional community preschool places across NSW.

Application for the Start Strong Capital Works Grants program were open in 2020. Following a competitive assessment process, 20 grant awards have been endorsed to date to renovate, extend or build new community preschools or to purchase new vehicles for a mobile preschool.

Five preschools received service approval during 2020-21 (as of 23 March 2021):

- One NSW Department of Education preschool
- Three community preschools
- One private for profit preschool

**177. The Berejiklian government announced (16/2) that the NSW Government will spend \$20 million to launch OOSH hubs across 47 schools by mid-2021, how many of these we will be not for profit providers, ensuring accessibility for all families and located on public school sites?**

There are 47 schools across NSW that will open an Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) hub by May 2021, as part of the NSW Government's \$120 million investment to reduce the cost of before and after school care, and improve access for families.

To date the Department of Education has prepared tenders for 18 of the 47 hubs, and five have been awarded as at 15 March 2021. Four of the successful applicants were classed as Category B not-for-profit providers.

OSHC hubs are allocated to schools based on demand requirements not category of provider type.

### **Commitments and spending**

**178. The department has said it is spending \$11.7 billion in 2020-21 in schools and the total public school budget is \$14.9 billion. What is the breakdown of the remaining \$3.2 billion by area (including the administrative costs of the department) in dollar figures?**

Around \$11.7 billion from the 2020-21 public schooling budget allocation of \$14.9 billion is expected to be spent directly within the school gate, including any amounts coming via the School Budget Allocation Report and from other budget sources.

The remaining \$3.2 billion further supports NSW public schools through:

- \$1.7 billion on infrastructure delivery
- Approximately \$800 million on centralised program spending and administration
- Approximately \$700 million on core costs supporting school operations including payroll, IT and finance.

**179. How much of the Public School budget (in dollars) is allocated to NESAs?**

Please refer to the 2020-21 Budget Paper no.2, p.2-1 under *High-quality standards for schooling*.

**180. How much do the Catholic and Independent sectors contribute to the cost of running NESAs?**

The Catholic and Independent Sectors do not make direct contributions to the cost of running the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA). NESA is funded through the Education Cluster budget allocated by NSW Treasury.

**181. What is the total special education budget for public schools in 2020-21? What was the total for 2019-20 and 2018-19?**

The Department provides a range of resources to ensure all students with disability are supported in a NSW public school.

More than 135,000 students are supported in NSW public schools, with adjustments to their learning because of disability including:

- more than \$294 million in 2020, through the Low level adjustment for disability equity loading;
- more than \$240 million in 2020, through Integration Funding Support for students in mainstream classes, supporting more than 11,000 students;
- more than 2,600 support classes in mainstream schools supporting more than 19,600 students;
- more than 980 support classes in schools for specific purposes (SSPs) supporting more than 5,500 students; and
- more than 440 specialist hearing and vision impairment itinerant teachers and assistant principals supporting more than 2,600 students.

Most of these supports are provided as part of a broader setting. For example, around 97 per cent of students with disability learn in mainstream public schools, and around 80 per cent of students with disability learn in mainstream classes within mainstream schools. Given this broader setting, cost estimates are not necessarily available at an individual class or student level, and are not able to be aggregated for direct comparison across the 2018-19 to 2020-21 financial years.

**182. What is the breakdown of the \$10.1 billion SBAR for 2021 including each of the RAM components (low SES, LLAD, English language proficiency, Aboriginal, remote and isolated, professional learning and location), base (operational and staffing) and the targeted funding (IFS, refugee and new arrivals)?**

**(a) What were the figures for each component in 2020 and 2019?**

Funding for schools is delivered through the Resource Allocation Model (RAM) which provisions funding through targeted equity and base components.

**183. How many additional teachers have been budgeted for in 2021, 2022 and 2023 and what is the additional amount budgeted each?**

**(a) What is the estimated total teaching FTE for 2021, 2022 and 2023 (casual, temporary and permanent)?**

The NSW Government made a commitment in 2019 to hire an additional 4600 teachers over four years. As at June 2020, there were 2,534 full-time equivalent (FTE) teachers added since March 2019.

**184. How many additional teachers are required each year to 2030 in NSW according to the department's current projections?**

Based on the Budget Paper 3 (BP3) forecasts, the additional teachers required until 2027 are shown in the table below. Note these forecast figures only go up to 2027 and are inclusive of all teaching levels (principals, school executive teaching staff and classroom teachers), and all employment types (permanent, temporary and casual arrangements).

(a) to (c) NSW public schools have been allocated \$288.9 million for the employment of educators. The spending on teachers, educator paraprofessionals, and educators (non-teacher) will vary from school to school based on the schools' program.

(d) Schools are permitted to spend 10 per cent of their allocated program funding on staff to support the program and supervise additional educators including:

- assessment, planning, programming, monitoring, evaluation, reporting and professional learning for educators delivering small group tuition

- supervision of educators (non-teachers) in before or after school tuition programs by teaching staff
- administrative support for tracking and monitoring funding using the WBS IO Solution.

(e) \$17.1 million has been allocated to coordinate and administer the program, including the design and delivery of the program, assessment, professional learning and teaching resources, assessment and management of the recruitment pool, and non-labour costs such as additional ClassCover licence expense.

**194. How are schools being supported by the Department to administer the program?**

To support schools to administer the program, the Department of Education provided the following resources:

- funding for schools to employ additional teachers and/or educators
- a taskforce to support program implementation and evaluation
- an employment pool of additional educators to allow principals to select staff who can meet their local needs
- a dedicated website with guidelines on expenditure, implementation and best practice
- flexibility around delivery of tuition, such as online models to support rural and remote students
- guidelines to support schools to identify students who would benefit from small group tuition
- recommendations about assessment tools that schools can use to monitor student progress
- professional learning and resources for schools, teachers and additional educators with different levels of expertise
- a Microsoft Teams forum and dedicated Yammer group for Directors Educational Leadership, principals, and staff delivering small group tuition to collaborate and share ideas
- webinars including Q&A for principals and COVID Intensive Learning Support Program coordinators
- Directors Educational Leadership presentations on the guidelines, support available and Q&A
- Targeted support for schools needing help to identify suitable tutors, with matching against registered applicants (and vice versa) and other solutions.

**195. What measures will the Department use to assess the effectiveness of the program?**

The Department of Education is developing an evaluation strategy for the program. Plans agreed to date include the use of a variety of quantitative and qualitative measures to assess the effectiveness of the program. Effectiveness will be based on whether the program is implemented as intended, whether schools, teachers, and whether the program leads to greater student achievement and engagement than would otherwise have been observed.

The Department's evaluation will assess effectiveness using the following as examples of data:

- the number of staff employed to deliver the program
- the number of students supported by the program
- student achievement data from assessments that schools are currently using such as NAPLAN and check-in assessments
- qualitative data about how the program has been implemented such as the frequency of tuition sessions, mode of tuition delivery, and learning areas of focus, which will be obtained via existing departmental reporting systems
- data from surveys and interviews with schools, educators delivering the program, classroom teachers, and students. This data will examine implementation, challenges, and the perceived impact of the program on student achievement and engagement
- student engagement data from the Department's Tell Them From Me surveys
- data that reflects the use of program resources such as website analytics and participation in professional learning
- feedback obtained via surveys and interviews about the value of professional learning and other resources designed to support the program.

**196. What accountability measures are in place for government oversight of the \$31 million of COVID Intensive Learning Support Program in non-government schools?**

The NSW Government has entered into funding agreements with the Association of Independent Schools of NSW and Catholic Schools NSW for the implementation of the COVID Intensive Learning Support Program. The funding agreements include conditions on the expenditure of funds for the delivery of small group tutoring, as well as requirements to provide the NSW Government with auditor-certified financial acquittals, and report on student performance evaluations.

As at March 2021, the number of secondary enrolments in NSW high schools is 323,443. This figure includes secondary enrolment for students in Central/Combined schools.

### **200. For 2021, please provide the current enrolment figures for every NSW public school including the enrolment cap and their capacity broken down by school and electorate.**

Every eligible student who wishes to attend a NSW public school will be given a place at their local school. Accordingly, the Department of Education does not have fixed enrolment capacities at NSW public schools. Schools have the capacity to adapt to fluctuating enrolments through the use of a combination of temporary and permanent teaching spaces.

All schools with enrolments above 150 students and that have an enrolment boundary, have a centrally set enrolment cap. Selective high schools, environmental education centres and schools for specific purposes do not have an enrolment boundary and do not have a centrally set cap. The enrolment cap is not an indication of the enrolment capacity of a school. It is used to specify when a school is unable to enrol non local students, except in exceptional circumstances.

The enrolment cap is based on the number of permanent classrooms in a school. This number varies as new buildings are constructed or current spaces are reclassified. The enrolment cap does not limit the number of local students a school can accommodate.

A list of all NSW public schools including the enrolment cap is attached at **TAB A**.

Please note:

Those schools without an enrolment cap, as specified above, are identified by #N/A.

Those schools whose enrolment cap is lower than 150 are identified by <150.

**(a) What criteria was used to access a schools need for electronic devices?**

A total of 13,666 devices were provided to schools as part of the Department's COVID-19 response between April 2020 and March 2021. This comprises 9,915 Windows laptops, 1,614 Chromebooks, and 2,137 iPads.

In addition, 8,517 internet connectivity devices (dongles) were provided.

These devices were made available as part of the Department's COVID-19 response to support the continuity of learning and is in addition to the regular Computer Equipment Rollout to schools.

- (a) The Department surveyed schools individually to determine demand for equipment and priority of the rollout was given to HSC students, students with disability or in need of specialised equipment, students in rural and remote communities, young people in out of home care, and students from low socioeconomic backgrounds.

### **Pre-Fabricated Schools**

Five schools have recently been completed using the Design for Manufacture and Assembly (DfMA) method, namely:

- Jordan Springs Public School;

In addition to a thorough commissioning process and defects liability monitoring, School Infrastructure NSW undertakes post occupancy reviews for all completed projects.

#### **207. Have you found any NSW suppliers for the design for manufacture and assembly buildings?**

While the NSW Government procurement policy precludes restricting competition based on a supplier's location within Australia, School Infrastructure NSW (SINSW) actively engages with industry to increase the capacity of NSW manufacturers to deliver school builds using this method of construction and manufacturing.

In August 2020, the Department released an invitation to tender by public advertisement with no restriction placed on who may tender for the Design for Manufacture and Assembly (DfMA) Prequalification Scheme.

This was to allow suppliers to prequalify as manufacturers of complete volumetric systems and/or significant structural elements of a schools built form, using DfMA services.

The Scheme will enable SINSW to:

- engage with a lead contractor and then the lead contractor subcontract part or all of its services scope to a Scheme Member (manufacturers); and
- engage directly with a Scheme Member for Services.

There are a number of suppliers with NSW based facilities on the Scheme.

## **High Risk Hub**

The high risk hub is a specialist compliance team which has a focus on assisting services with ongoing and potentially systemic non-compliance concerns to improve governance arrangements, compliance with the National Law and enhance the service's focus on improved outcomes for children's health, safety and well-being.

The compliance team conducts detailed compliance monitoring activities of services and uses appropriate regulatory sanctions in a proportionate risk based approach to respond to any National Law breach. This approach results in a service either ensuring its provision of education care services complies with the National Law and increases quality practices and outcomes for children, or results in the imposition of sanctions to address any risks to children and thereby ensuring that children's health and safety remains paramount.

## **NSW Public School Data**

### **215. What is in place to protect the data that google and other online platforms collect in NSW schools, particularly during the remote learning period?**

The Department of Education's use of NSW ProcureIT contracts includes security terms and conditions on the protection of customer data.

In contracts that purchase services directly from online platforms, the Department includes conditions that ensure the protection of students' private details. For example, student Google accounts are separated from consumer accounts, their information remains their own property, and while Google's privacy policy specifies they may share aggregated and de-identified information, they do not share student information, link them to consumer accounts, or present them with advertisements.

Access to systems such as Google Classroom and Office 365 is through the Department login and password to secure access for students and teachers.

**219. How many NSW High schools currently have a student support officer? Please provide a list broken down by number of positions available, number of positions currently filled and employment type.**

The Government's election commitment is to provide every high school with a fulltime counsellor allocation and a fulltime ongoing student support officer by 2023.

In 2020, 183 schools were allocated a student support officer position. These positions have been allocated to secondary schools, central/ community schools and schools for specific purposes.

Recruitment is underway to fill the vacant positions.

A further 207 schools will be allocated a full-time ongoing student support officer position from July 2021 and 74 schools will be allocated their position from July 2022.

In addition to these positions, individual schools may choose to use their available funding to engage a temporary student support officer to support their school's wellbeing needs.

**220. How many NSW Primary schools currently have a student support officer? Please provide a list broken down by number of positions available, number of positions currently filled and employment type.**

Primary schools are not being allocated student support officer positions as part of the NSW Government's mental health election commitment.

Individual primary schools may choose to use their available funding to engage a temporary student support officer to support their school's wellbeing needs.

**221. How many teachers are currently enrolled in the Master of Professional Psychology (School Psychology) graduate scholarship program?**  
**(a) How many people were enrolled in 2020?**  
**(b) How many places are available in 2021?**

There are 43 teachers currently enrolled in the Master of Professional Practice (School Psychology) program and 6 teachers enrolled in the Master of Professional Psychology (School Psychology) program. Both programs are part of the new school counsellor retraining program at Charles Sturt University, which commenced in 2021.

- a) 71 teachers commenced in the school counsellor training program in 2020 through the Graduate Psychology Program at the University of Wollongong.

This program was replaced in 2021 by the Master of Professional Practice (School Psychology) program through Charles Sturt University.

- b) 50 places were available in the Master of Professional Practice (School Psychology) program in 2021.

**222. How many teachers are enrolled in the school counsellor in training sponsorship program?**

**(a) How many were enrolled in 2020?**

**(b) How many places are available in 2021?**

There are 76 teachers currently sponsored. This includes, 43 teachers currently enrolled in the Master of Professional Practice (School Psychology) program, 6 teachers enrolled in the Master of Professional Psychology (School Psychology) program, and 27 teachers completing undergraduate psychology studies prior to starting the school counsellor in training program.

- a) In 2020, there were 131 teachers enrolled in the school counsellor in training program. This included 71 teachers who commenced training in 2020 and 60 teachers completing training during 2020.
- b) 50 places were available in the Master of Professional Practice (School Psychology) program in 2021.

In addition, 27 teachers are being sponsored to complete their undergraduate psychology studies prior to starting the school counsellor in training program.

**Childcare Regulations**

**223. Why doesn't a nominated supervisor become ineligible to be fit and proper person until they are convicted of an offence?**

The National Law and Regulations do not confer any functions on the Department to assess, or reassess, an individual's fitness and propriety to be a nominated supervisor. Approved Providers are responsible for these assessments.

However, the National Law does allow the Department to issue a prohibition notice to a person to:

- (a) prohibit the person from being nominated as a nominated supervisor if the Department considers the person is not a fit and proper person to be nominated as a nominated supervisor of a service; or

- (b) impose one or more conditions on the nomination of the person as a nominated supervisor that the Department considers appropriate, if the Department considers that the person is a fit and proper person to be nominated as a nominated supervisor of a service subject to those conditions.

A finding of a lack of fitness and propriety, for the purposes of issuing a prohibition notice, is not solely based upon a conviction for an offence. The Department may decide to issue a prohibition notice in circumstances where, for example, the nominated supervisor no longer meets the minimum requirements for the role or where other circumstances indicate that a person is no longer fit and proper. Although not defined in the National Law or Regulations, a failure to meet the minimum requirements, or the presence of other circumstances, could be caused by a number of situations. Where such circumstances arise, the matter will be considered based upon the individual facts of each case.

**224. Why are the Red Nose safe sleeping guidelines not mandatory at all NSW early childhood learning and care centres?**

The Education and Care Services National Law and Regulations detail the operational and legal requirements for education and care services. Under regulation 168, all services are required to have in place policies and procedures relating to children's health and safety, including matters relating to sleep and rest.

Services are encouraged to refer to current research and best practice guidelines developed by recognised national authorities, such as Red Nose, to inform their policies, procedures and practices. The National Law and Regulations, however, do not mandate specific practices in relation to sleep and rest as it is expected that policies and procedures are developed to reflect each service's specific circumstances, including the needs of the children attending the service.

Sleep and rest requirements are being considered in the Education Council's 2019 Review of the National Quality Framework, including options for further legislative change. NSW has made recommendations that requirements around sleep and rest should be further clarified.

To support best practice, the Department will continue to work with Red Nose to share resources and guidance on safe sleeping with education and care services.

**Cyber Attack**

**225. Can you update us on whether there have been any cyber-attacks on the Department of Education over the past 12 months, were the personal information of staff and students was breached?**

There have been no breaches of Department systems where staff or student data was extracted.

**226. Was the Department of Education affected in anyway by the recent cyber-attack on NSW Health and Transport for NSW that has been reported extensively in the media?**

- (a) What additional cyber security measures has your Department implemented after the NSW Department of Education's Microsoft SharePoint system was subject to a phishing attack last year?**
- (b) Did the Department implement any additional cyber security measures last year during the lockdown period when school children were required to do school work from home? Were there any additional protections to ensure the NSW Education IT system is not vulnerable from attack through students working on their home computers?**

The Department was not subject to the attacks that were reported on NSW Health and Transport for NSW.

- (a) Working with Microsoft, the Department implemented changes to the SharePoint system and updated cyber security resources provided to staff.
- (b) Actions taken by the Department included:

Students' access to resources through the student portal was safe and secure, and information on using technology at home was provided to parents and carers, including resources developed by the eSafety Commissioner, and promotion of the NSW Digital Citizenship website.

Individual and school instances of the Zoom videoconferencing application were superseded by an enterprise wide product providing consistent security and management controls across students and schools. SIM cards issued were configured to protect students from malicious and inappropriate websites.

The Learning from Home Hub provided staff, students, parents and carers with access to curriculum and assessment advice, teaching resources, online professional learning, support mechanisms and operational advice. This meant the use of unknown third party products was not required.

### **Before and After School Care**

- 227. How many NSW Public Schools currently have before and after school care on school grounds? Can you please provide a list broken down by school, number of approved places, number of places filled and operating hours?**
- (a) How many places were created from August 2020 – September 2020?**
  - (b) How many places were created from October 2020 – November 2020?**
  - (c) How many places were created from December 2020 – January 2020?**
  - (d) How many places were created from February 2021 – current date?**

As at 10 March 2021, there are 790 NSW public schools who have on-site before and after school care. A breakdown of the schools and approved places is provided below.

The Department of Education does not maintain information on places filled of individual services as part of its function as the NSW Regulatory Authority for early

childhood education and care. Providers are responsible for sharing enrolment availability and information.

- (a) August 2020 – September 2020 (1/8/2020 – 30 September 2020) – Net increase in on-site BASC places: 391.
- (b) October 2020 – November 2020 (1/10/2020 – 30 November 2020) – Net increase in on-site BASC places: 421.
- (c) December 2020 – January 2021 (1/12/2020 – 31 January 2021) – Net increase in on-site BASC places: 2,119.
- (d) February 2021 – current date (1/2/2021 – 3 March 2021) – Net increase in on-site BASC places: 169.

The \$120 million BASC program budget includes:

- \$50 million for new facilities and equipment;
- \$40 million in rental subsidies;
- \$20 million for innovative solutions to meet the needs of smaller schools, particularly those in rural and remote NSW;
- \$8 million to create a specialist team to support principals in administering these vital services, and
- \$2 million to create a new website and mobile application.

The program is almost two years into the four year commitment. During financial year 2019-2020, almost \$11 million in actual expenditure was recorded. Spend for the 2020-2021 financial year is estimated to be over \$25 million as at 12 March 2021, and this figure will be updated at the end of the financial year.

**236. What provision is there for an out-of-area enrolment at another public school, if there is no before and after school care at your local public school?**

The NSW Government's \$120 million before and after school care commitment seeks to improve access to care for all NSW families. The program seeks to improve access to care broadly across NSW, over enrolment changes.

### **Wee Waa High School**

**237. Was the advice provided to NSW department of Education regarding the contamination at Wee Waa high school from the local health district?  
(a) If not, please outline where that advice came from?**

Following the initial reports of health issues at Wee Waa High School perceived to be caused by mould exposure, the Department of Education received advice from a number of sources including from an independent occupational hygienist. School Infrastructure NSW also worked with the Department's Health and Safety Directorate, and later engaged NSW Health to provide support.

**238. If a new high school is required to be built at Wee Waa, as a result of the mould contamination, will it be on the existing site? If not, where will that be?**

Preliminary site investigations have begun on potential alternative sites in Wee Waa. Appropriate due diligence will be undertaken which includes stormwater and flooding assessments to ensure a potential new school is built on appropriate land. No decision on an alternative site will be made without appropriate consultation with the Principal and the school community.

A Project Reference Group has been established for consultation purposes and will help to inform the options under consideration.

#### **241. How will you measure the success of the tutoring program?**

The Department of Education is developing an evaluation strategy for the program. Plans agreed to date include the use of a variety of quantitative and qualitative measures to assess the effectiveness of the program. Effectiveness will be based on whether the program is implemented as intended, whether schools, teachers, and whether the program leads to greater student achievement and engagement than would otherwise have been observed.

The Department's evaluation will assess effectiveness using the following as examples of data:

- the number of staff employed to deliver the program
- the number of students supported by the program

- student achievement data from assessments that schools are currently using such as NAPLAN and check-in assessments
- qualitative data about how the program has been implemented such as the frequency of tuition sessions, mode of tuition delivery, and learning areas of focus, which will be obtained via existing departmental reporting systems
- data from surveys and interviews with schools, educators delivering the program, classroom teachers, and students. This data will examine implementation, challenges, and the perceived impact of the program on student achievement and engagement
- student engagement data from the Department's Tell Them From Me surveys
- data that reflects the use of program resources such as website analytics and participation in professional learning
- feedback obtained via surveys and interviews about the value of professional learning and other resources designed to support the program.

## **RAM Funding**

### **242. Can you please provide the 2021 allocation of RAM funding broken down by school, funding allocation for all three components; targeted funding, equity funding and base school allocation funding?**

The Resource Allocation Model (RAM) is delivered as three components: targeted funding, equity loadings and base school allocation.

In 2021:

The total allocation of RAM targeted funding is \$242 million.

The total allocation of RAM equity loadings is \$1,004.7 million including socio-economic background, Aboriginal background, English language proficiency and low level adjustment for disability.

The total RAM base school allocation is \$8,848.6 million including staffing (teaching/school administrative and support staff) and operational components.

### **243. Number of students in NSW public schools who access targeted funding broken down by refugee student support, new arrivals program and integrated funding support?**

Number of recently arrived (three years or less) refugee students supported by targeted (individual student) funding:

**244. Number of students in NSW public schools who access equity loading broken down by socio-economic background, aboriginal background, English language proficiency and low level adjustment for disability?**

In 2021:

Socio-economic background equity loading provides learning support for 412,621 students in NSW public schools.

Aboriginal background equity loading provides learning support for 67,577 students in NSW public schools.

English language proficiency equity loading provides learning support for 200,530 students in NSW public schools.

Low level adjustment for disability equity loading provides learning support for over 135,000 students in NSW public schools.

**Staggered Lunchtimes**

**245. How many schools are staggering lunchtimes?**

Principals are the senior decision-makers in the school and they use a variety of consultative practices for the organisational arrangements of the school they lead and manage. The Principal is best placed to make decisions in the local context to meet the needs of their students, in line with relevant legislation, with industrial awards and agreements and departmental policies and priorities.

Staggered lunch times are implemented by some schools to provide flexibility in the way that student supervision and playground use are managed.

**246. How many schools are currently using community facilities for their students to play at lunchtime? Please provide a list of the schools and name of the community facility.**

Principals are the senior decision-makers in the school and they use a variety of consultative practices for the organisational arrangements of the school they lead and manage. The Principal is best placed to make decisions in the local context to meet the needs of their students, in line with relevant legislation, with industrial awards and agreements and departmental policies and priorities.

Principals make local decisions regarding the use of community facilities based on a range of conditions including but not limited to:

- access to facilities
- varying social needs of children at different ages
- supervision arrangements.

## **School Success Model**

### **247. How are Best in Class teachers being utilised?**

The Best in Class initiative helps teachers across NSW to engage with effective and evidence-based teaching practice.

Best in Class is designing, trialling and evaluating a range of approaches to identify which operating models are most effective for amplifying the practice of outstanding teaching whilst supporting them to continue teaching in the classroom.

All models support outstanding teachers to continue teaching classes in school whilst apportioning some of their time to strengthening the research base and building the capacity of teachers across NSW public schools. Schools are being resourced to support the time teachers are contributing to system-wide improvement.

Currently 66 outstanding teachers are supporting system improvement through high impact professional learning whilst remaining grounded in classroom practice.

The provision of support for schools varies according to which Best in Class team a teacher is attached to. Some teams, such as the HSC team, develop and deliver professional learning and resources that are available for all schools offering the HSC. Other teams, such as the Maths Growth Team, are located in schools that have been selected following extensive data analysis.

### **248. How are highly accomplished teachers being utilised?**

Teachers who have already gained Highly Accomplished (HA) accreditation are required to robustly maintain that accreditation throughout their careers. They do so by consistently demonstrating their own exemplary teaching practice and by using their expertise to develop the teaching practice of other teachers in their schools.

The Department has a number of new programs that are focussed on the identification and use of outstanding teachers to collaboratively lead professional development in evidence-based teaching practices that will improve the practice of other teachers. Inbuilt evaluation strategies will provide data and findings to better inform future utilisation of the Department's expert teachers.

### **249. Given, the new NAPLAN analysis by UNSW, that showed some of the best performing schools are in the middle to lower income areas, how will schools be matched to statistically similar schools under the School Success Model?**

Schools have set their student performance targets based on statistically similar schools, as part of their 2021-2024 Strategic Improvement Plan. A number of factors have been considered in determining statistically similar schools including the socio-economic status of students as indicated by the Family Occupation and Education Index, a measure developed with independent advice from statistics professors from the University of Wollongong. The school target methodology has been developed by educational statisticians in the Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation in

partnership with educational leaders in the Department. All schools, no matter their socio-economic status or performance, have growth targets.

## Early Childhood Services

### 250. How many early childhood education and care services exist in NSW?

As at 28 February 2021 there were 5,792 early childhood education and care services in NSW.

**253. How many additional approved places will be created by the rollout of the 47 OSHC hubs at each individual school set to receive an OSHC hub, or which has received an OSHC hub?**

**(a) Of the 47 schools set to receive, or who have already received, an OSHC hub, which schools had existing OSHC services on site during 2020?**

- i. How did the Government determine which schools would receive a hub?**

**(b) A media release dated February 15, 2021, released by the Premier, (<https://www.nsw.gov.au/media-releases/thousands-of-students-to-benefit-from-out-of-school-hours-care-places>) said, “The new hubs are an innovative way of providing additional before and after school care for more than 2400 students across the state.” In the context of this statement, what does “additional before and after school care” mean?**

- (d) If they are not all new approved places, how many of the 2400 approved places are new or how many additional places have/will the 47 OSHC hubs create?**
- (e) How has the Government calculated the aforementioned figure of 2400 students?**
- (f) At the February 15 media conference announcing the 47 OSCH hubs at Camden Park Public School, the Premier said, “During school hours, the school is actually able to use the multipurpose space as well.” How will schools be able to use these “multipurpose spaces”?**
- i. Will these “multipurpose spaces” impact play ratios at the public schools which host them? If so, how?**

As part of the NSW Government’s \$120 million investment over four years to expand access to before and after school care for public primary school children, 47 schools across NSW will open an Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) hub by May 2021.

The OSHC hub program is increasing the number of approved BASC places, and 2,400 is the anticipated net increase.

As at 15 March 2021 hubs have been delivered to 18 schools for installation. Each is at a different stage of completion, from commencing site works to being fully operational.

- (a) The OSHC Hub program was designed to improve access to Before and After School Care (BASC), including implementing new on-site services and increasing the capacity of existing providers on NSW Government school sites.**

- i-ii Schools have been shortlisted and prioritised for an OSHC hub according to the level of unmet demand for OSHC, and the availability of suitable space to place the modular facility on the government school site.

The information used for this prioritisation was gathered during consultation undertaken by the Department throughout 2019 with providers, school principals and parents.

- iii The BASC program has used demand data to determine the allocation of OSHC hubs for each school that will or has received one.

- (b) The BASC program is improving access to care for all NSW public primary school students in a range of ways including, in the context of this statement, increasing the number of approved places offered by providers.
- (c) Yes. The OSHC hub program is increasing the number of approved BASC places, and 2,400 is the anticipated net increase. Approved places relates to the capacity of services to offer care, and not student enrolments.
- (d) The OSCH hub program will create new approved BASC places.
- (e) This is the anticipated net increase in approved BASC places, using the capacity of each individual hub.
- (f) In addition to supporting schools to implement or expand their before and after school care services, the OSHC hubs provide multipurpose spaces for use during school hours and in holiday periods.

The Department supports schools to use the multipurpose spaces at their discretion, and potential uses may include staff meetings and student activity areas.

- i. Key objectives of the OSHC hubs are to provide additional indoor capacity, and optimise usable outdoor space.
- ii. The hubs may appear similar to a demountable classroom from the outside, but are fitted with facilities to meet the OSHC needs of students, schools and providers including accessibility ramps, kitchens, storage units, toilets, and showers.

- (g) Yes. Each OSHC hub was assessed and prioritised based on need and suitability, to create additional BASC capacity using existing NSW Government sites. The school receives an asset available to them outside of OSCH hours, and parents and carers benefit from increased access to care.

#### **Before and after school care election commitment**

**254. On March 10, 2019 a media release titled “Before and after school care for all public primary school primary school students”, in the names of Gladys Berejiklian, Rob Stokes and Sarah Mitchell, stated “Before and after school care will be made available to all parents with children at public primary schools by 2021 under a NSW Liberal and Nationals Government.” Is before and after school care now available for all parents with children at public primary schools?**

**(a) If not, why don’t all public primary school students in NSW have access to OSHC?**

- i. When will all public primary school students who need an OSHC place have access to a place?**

The NSW Government has committed \$120 million to improve access to before and after school care over four years, and the program is progressing as a priority.

- (a) The BASC program team is working with families, schools and approved

providers across NSW to implement strategies to improve access to care. As at 3 March 2021, the BASC program has resulted in a net increase of 124 BASC services and 14,002 new approved places across NSW since July 2019.

- i. The number of places delivered will be targeted to meet unmet demand throughout the four year commitment and beyond.

## **Before and After School Care Transport**

**255. On 16 April 2019 the Liberal party media release (<https://nsw.liberal.org.au/BEFORE-AND-AFTER-SCHOOL-CARE-COMING-SOON-TO-A-SCHOOL-NEAR-YOU>) announced “Before and after school care for all children at public primary schools is on track for 2021”. The media release stated the Government would commit \$120m to achieve this. It also quoted the Premier as saying, “No matter where you live or what your circumstances are, parents should have access to quality and affordable out of school hours care for their children.” **Based on this statement, as of January 1, 2021, do all NSW public primary school children, no matter where the child lives or what their circumstances have access to OSHC?****

- (a) The same media release said “smaller or remote schools where an on-site service is not feasible, transport will be offered to get students to and from offsite providers or other schools”. Is this transport now available at all smaller or remote schools where an on-site service is not feasible?**
  - i. At what smaller or remote schools is this transport solution being offered?**
  - ii. How many smaller or remote schools have received this transport solution as a result of this announcement, or since April 2019?**
  - iii. At what smaller or remote schools is this transport solution not currently available?**
  - iv. When will this transport solution be delivered to all smaller and remote schools?**

The NSW Government has committed \$120 million to improve access to before and after school care over four years, and the program is progressing as a priority.

The BASC program has allocated the \$20 million Implementation Fund for innovative solutions to meet the needs of smaller communities and schools, particularly those in rural and remote areas, and is continuing to work with regional and remote schools to progress transport solutions as a priority.

Jesmond Public School has received direct funding for transport solutions to date, and additional funding will become available as part of the Bathurst-Lithgow group of schools tender which opened on 1 March 2021, and is currently in train.

## **Before and after School Care procurement rules**

**256. According to question number 4010 on the Questions and Answers Paper No. 441, it was stated that it is not permitted under applicable NSW Government procurement frameworks, policies and codes of practice for approved providers of OSHC to offer school principals “health checks” and assessments of current OSHC services being delivered by another approved provider. Is the Government aware that Camp Australia, via the Australian Primary Principals Association website (<https://appa.asn.au/items-of-interest/camp-australia/>), is offering to conduct a free “health check” on OSHC services it does not operate?**

- (a) Does the Government consider this to be a breach of NSW Government procurement frameworks, policies and codes of practice?**
- (b) What are the penalties, if any, for an approved provider who is caught operating outside of the procurement frameworks, policies and codes of practice?**
- (c) Will the Government investigate which NSW OSHC services have undergone a so-called “Health check”?**

Yes.

- (a-b) No. The NSW Government Procurement Policy Framework does not prevent providers marketing their services.**
- (c) No.**

## **Before and After School Waiting Lists**

**257. During the Budget Estimates hearing, on March 3, 2021, Mr Mark Scott stated that the department does “monitor waiting lists and refresh them” in relation to Before and After School Care. How frequently are these lists refreshed?**

- (a) What methodologies are used to maintain this list?**
- (b) What information is recorded on this list?**
- (c) Is this list used to assist Government in determining how and where to provide Before and After School Care?**
- (d) As at 3 March 2021,**
  - i. How many children does the Department estimate are on waiting lists for a place in Before and After School Care?**
  - ii. What is the average time spent on waiting lists?**
- (e) Please provide the most recent waitlist monitoring data, by location.**

The Department currently uses two main types of surveys to ascertain need for services through consultation with BASC stakeholders - surveys for parents and NSW Government Public Schools and a Census of OSHC Providers in NSW. The surveys are regularly conducted throughout the school year, and during 2020 three parent surveys, three general provider surveys and one principal survey were run. The BASC program team is currently prioritising the development of another parent survey, which is due for release at the beginning of Term 2 2021.

- (a) Surveys of BASC stakeholders.**
- (b) A range of information is captured in the surveys tailored to the stakeholder, such as appetite for new services, and space waivers.**
- (c) Yes.**

(d-e) The Department does not maintain day-to-day information on vacancies or waitlists. Approved providers are responsible for sharing enrolment availability and information when requested.

### **Death or Serious Incident**

**258. Does the Minister agree that it would be out of step with community expectations for an early childhood learning centre to receive an increase in National Quality Standard rating if a death of a child had occurred at that centre and the coroner had not yet issued their finding in relation to the reasons and circumstances of death?**

The community expects the Department of Education, as the NSW regulatory authority, to ensure that services are operating in a manner which ensures the health, safety and wellbeing of children.

To do this, the Department undertakes regular monitoring and compliance visits to ensure compliance with the National Law and Regulations, as well as point in time assessment and rating to assess a service against the National Quality Standards.

There are circumstances in which the Department can postpone an assessment and rating visit to a service. The Department will continue to review when a delay might be appropriate. In such circumstances, regulation of the service will be undertaken through monitoring and compliance visits.

**259. According to the February 2021 Report on Government Services, the number of serious incidents in National Quality Framework [NQF] approved early childhood education and care centres has risen from 99.8 serious incidents per 100 services in 2017-18 to 106.2 serious incidents per 100 services in 2019-20. The number of serious incidents at NQF approved early childhood education and care services continues to rise, year on year. How does the Department explain the increased number of serious incidents?**

**(a) What actions are being taken to improve safety within the early childhood education and care setting?**

**(b) Given that serious incidents are required to be self-reported by the service within 24 hours, how are parents educated about this requirement so that parents can report a serious incident if the service fails to?**

The Department of Education actively encourages services to report serious incidents.

It is preferred that services over-report than under-report as part of effective risk management. The National Law defines what is classified as a serious incident, however, the interpretation of this definition by services can be broad.

Whilst the number of serious incidents reported to the Department has increased slightly, the proportion of these reports requiring any follow up action by the

Department has reduced by 35 per cent over this same period, indicating an overall reduction in the seriousness of these incidents.

- a) The best way for the Department, as the regulator, to reduce or prevent serious incidents occurring in services is to ensure high levels of visibility of service operations and to support services to take corrective or preventative action prior to any serious incident occurring.

In 2020, the Department has undertaken more service visits than ever before with more than 90 per cent of all NSW services being visited. The Department has also taken steps to ensure that service visits are more effective in preventing serious incidents by expanding visit checklists to identify more breaches and taking action to have any identified breaches rectified by services.

The Department also takes an educative focus to support the early childhood sector to understand requirements under the National Law and Regulations and how this translates into best practice. Initiatives to enhance the capabilities of services and improve safety include the Working Towards National Quality Standard Quality Support Program (in conjunction with The Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority), supporting children's health workshops, emergency planning workshops and resources, risk management webinars, and the Sector Development Program which delivers free training and resources.

- b) Under Regulation 168, services are required to have in place policies and procedures in relation to a range of prescribed issues including serious incidents and dealing with complaints. Regulation 171 requires that services have these policies available at the service at all times and Regulation 172 requires that parents be notified of any changes to these policies 14 days prior to the change occurring.

Additionally, Regulation 173 prescribes information which must be displayed by the service and includes both the name and phone number of the person at the education and care service to whom complaints may be addressed and the contact details of the Regulatory Authority.

The National Law and Regulations are designed to ensure parent awareness of the requirements as they apply to services. In addition, the NSW Regulatory Authority has published information on their website (<https://education.nsw.gov.au/early-childhood-education/investigation-feedback-and-complaints/how-to-give-feedback-or-make-a-complaint>) about what parents can report to the Regulatory Authority and how they can make a report or complaint.

In addition, the Regulatory Authority provides information about how complaints can be made or concerns raised in all media responses relating to serious incidents.

**260. According to the February 2021 Report on Government Services, there were 13,673 regulatory breaches at early childhood education and care services in 2019-20, compared to 7773 in 2018-19. This constitutes a 73% increase. ACECQA has attributed the increase in regulatory breaches to “ongoing focus by state regulatory authorities on compliance with the National Law and Regulations”. In what ways has the regulatory authority increased its focus on compliance with the National Law and Regulations?**

**(a) Have there been occasions where breaches have occurred because staff were unaware of the regulations or due to staff error?**

**i. If so, on how many occasions have regulations been breached because staff were unaware of the regulations?**

This increase in confirmed breaches can be attributed to a number of factors.

Increased visibility in services by the Department of Education is a key factor. Between 2019 and 2020, the Department increased unannounced spot checks by 37 per cent between 2019 and 2020 and visited over 90 per cent of all NSW services during 2020. This included targeted compliance campaigns to services deemed to be higher risk. NSW now has no service whose last visit by the regulatory authority was prior to 2019.

NSW also enhanced the process of recording breaches in 2020 to enable officers to identify, rectify and record any breaches to the law or regulations with relative ease.

Pro-active detection and early intervention undertaken by the Department in relation to the detection and correction of breaches of the law and regulation contributes to the prevention of serious incidents or injury to children. The number of breaches indicates a high level of preventative regulatory activity.

a) This response assumes “staff” refers to service staff.

Some breaches are likely to occur because staff in services are unaware of the regulations or due to staff error. While approved providers are responsible for ensuring staff are trained to understand and meet regulations, the Department’s Authorised Officers also undertake an educative role when visiting services and provide guidance on minor breaches. This often means further formal compliance action is not needed.

i) This information is not available.

**261. What is the Department’s policy relating to a death or serious incident at an early childhood learning centre, particularly when the death or serious incident is suspicious or for which the provider may be culpable?**

- (a) Noting that the national law allows for a service's approval to be immediately suspended, under Departmental policy what circumstances would trigger an immediate shutdown and review of operational policies in the event of a death or serious incident at an early childhood learning centre?**
- (b) What process is undertaken by the Department in determining whether and what kind of additional conditions of approval can be attached to an early childhood learning centre's approval?**
  - i. In the event that a need for additional conditions of approval is identified, how long does it take for the additional conditions to be applied?**

Any death or serious incident is referred to the Compliance and Investigations unit within Early Childhood Education for the conduct of a formal investigation to ascertain whether there is evidence to establish that there has been a breach of the National Law.

If a breach of the National Law is substantiated to the requisite standard of proof, or the service is being operated in a manner that poses a risk to the safety, health or wellbeing of children, a number of sanctions may be imposed by the Department of Education. These sanctions range from a caution through to a prosecution for a substantiated offence. Administrative sanctions are also available to address any risks to children and these may include the suspension or cancellation of a service or provider approval and the prohibition of a person. Additional conditions may also be imposed on a provider or service approval. All compliance responses taken by the Department are risk based and are commensurate with and proportionate to all the circumstances of the established breach.

- a) Under Section 73 of the National Law, the Department may immediately suspend a service approval where it is satisfied that there is an immediate risk to the safety, health or wellbeing of children being educated and cared for at a service. In determining whether there is immediate risk to children all the facts and circumstances of the incident are assessed, including whether a service has taken immediate action to mitigate any risk; and whether there is any evidence that clearly establishes non-compliance by a service demonstrative of negligence or recklessness.
- b) Additional conditions may be imposed on a provider or a service approval to address any potential risks of non-compliance or risks to children. Conditions on a provider or service approval may be imposed when the approval is initially granted or may be added to an approval following the completion of an investigation by the Department in response to any serious incident or non-compliance by the approved provider or the service.

In accordance with the principles of procedural fairness, the investigative process will involve the collection of documentary evidence, obtaining sworn witness statements and interviews of approved providers (under caution). All the evidence obtained is analysed and assessed to determine whether any breach of the National Law can be substantiated to the requisite standard of

proof or whether a service is being operated in a manner that may pose a risk to the safety, health or well of children.

- i) Additional conditions may be imposed with immediate effect, or after a specific time in order to afford a provider with an opportunity to implement any necessary changes in its operations consistent with the terms of the condition.

The Department's decision to amend an approval by imposing conditions is a reviewable decision, and an application for review can be lodged by a provider.

**262. What is the Department of Education's definition of a "fit and proper" person when assessing applications to become a nominated supervisor?**

- (a) Noting that the regulatory authority may at any time reassess an individual's fitness and propriety to be a nominated supervisor, what circumstances trigger such a reassessment?**
- (b) In the event that a reassessment of an individual's fitness and propriety to be a nominated supervisor takes place, what circumstances warrant an individual no longer being considered a fit and proper person?**
- (c) How many people who had been considered a fit and proper person were reassessed and found to no longer be a fit and proper person in each of the following years:**
  - i. 2015**
  - ii. 2016**
  - iii. 2017**
  - iv. 2018**
  - v. 2019**
  - vi. 2020**

The National Law and Regulations require the Department of Education to assess approved providers as 'fit and proper' persons but do not confer any functions on the Department for the assessment of applications in respect to nominated supervisors. The appointment of an appropriate nominated supervisor is the responsibility of the approved provider of the education and care service. The approved provider must ensure a nominated supervisor meets the minimum requirements as set out in the National Law and Regulations.

- (a) The National Law and Regulations do not confer any functions on the Department to assess or reassess, at any time, an individual's fitness and propriety to be a nominated supervisor. The appointment of an appropriate nominated supervisor is the responsibility of the approved provider of the education and care service. However, the National Law allows the Department to issue a prohibition notice to a person to prohibit the person from being nominated as a nominated supervisor under some circumstances; or impose one or more conditions on the nomination of a person.

- (b) The National Law and Regulations do not confer any functions on the Department to assess or reassess, at any time, an individual's fitness and propriety to be a nominated supervisor.
- (c) The National Law and Regulations do not confer any functions on the Department to assess or reassess, at any time, an individual's fitness and propriety to be a nominated supervisor.

**263. In the event of a death or serious incident at an early childhood education learning and care centre, what process is undertaken to determine whether, and which, additional conditions of approval are needed?**

In the event of a death or serious incident at a centre, the Department will undertake an investigation. In accordance with the principles of procedural fairness, the investigative process would involve the collection of documentary evidence, obtaining sworn witness statements and interviews of approved providers (under caution). All of the evidence that has been obtained is analysed and assessed to determine whether any breach of the National Law can be substantiated to the requisite standard of proof, or whether a service is being operated in a manner that may pose a risk to the safety, health or wellbeing of children.

If warranted based on this evidence, additional conditions may be imposed on a provider or a service approval to address any potential risks of non-compliance or risks to children.

Conditions on a provider or service approval may be imposed when the approval is initially granted or may be added to an approval following the completion of an investigation by the Department in response to any serious incident or non-compliance by the approved provider or the service.

**264. Why are Red Nose safe sleeping guidelines, which are considered best practice, not mandatory at all NSW early childhood learning and care centres?**

The Education and Care Services National Law and Regulations detail the operational and legal requirements for education and care services. Under Regulation 168, all services are required to have in place policies and procedures relating to children's health and safety, including matters relating to sleep and rest.

Services are encouraged to refer to current research and best practice guidelines developed by recognised national authorities, such as Red Nose, to inform their policies, procedures and practices. The National Law and Regulations do not currently mandate specific practices in relation to sleep and rest as it is expected that policies and procedures are developed to reflect the specific needs of the children attending the service.

Sleep and rest requirements are being considered in the Education Council's 2019 Review of the National Quality Framework, including options for further legislative change. NSW has made recommendations that requirements around sleep and rest should be further clarified.

To support best practice, the Department will continue to work with Red Nose to provide resources, training and guidance on safe sleep and rest to education and care services.

- 265. Noting that fourteen early childhood education and care services had approvals cancelled in the twelve months prior to March 2021 and that one service had its approval suspended in the twelve months prior to March 2021. What are the names of the services which had approvals cancelled?**
- (a) What is the name of the service which had its approval suspended?**
  - (b) What are the names of any services which had approvals cancelled or suspended in the twelve months to March 2020?**
    - i. On what basis were each of these services' approvals cancelled or suspended?**

- i.) Of the 44 services cancelled, 41 were cancelled as a result of the associated provider approval being cancelled and the other three were due to a condition of the service approval not being complied with. One service was suspended for a breach of the Act or Regulation and the other was no longer operating at the approved premises.

**266. How can parents considering sending their child to a particular early childhood education service ascertain whether a compliance direction or notice, penalty infringement notice, emergency action notice, prohibition notice, variation or suspension of approval, enforceable undertaking and / or prosecution has occurred at that service?**

The Department of Education currently publishes information about where a conviction has been recorded on their website at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/early-childhood-education/investigation-feedback-and-complaints/published-enforcement-and-decision-actions>.

Other information relating to compliance actions taken that is not publishable under the National Law is subject to privacy laws and is not publicly released.

Regulation 177(1)(m) requires an approved provider to keep a record of the service's compliance with the Law, as set out in Regulation 167. The record of the service's compliance must include details of any amendment of the service approval made by the Regulatory Authority, details of any suspension of the service approval (other than a voluntary suspension) and the details of any compliance direction or compliance notice issued to the approved provider. Further, the approved provider must ensure that the record of compliance is able to be accessed on request by any person.

Parents can access information about a service's quality rating from the National Register, or by asking to see the ratings display within a service.

Parents can rest assured that if services are operating, they are deemed to be delivering safe education and care services.

### **National Quality Framework**

**267. According to data from the Australian Children's Education & Care Quality Authority [ACECQA], 22% of early childhood education and care providers in NSW are failing to meet the National Quality Standards [NQS] in Quality Area 2, "Children's Health and Safety". For how long is it acceptable for an early childhood education and care service to be "working towards" achieving the National Quality Standard in this area?**

- (a) Noting that there are locations in this State with a shortfall of early childcare education and care places, limiting parental choice as to which services to use, is there any other incentive for an early education and care provider to achieve an assessment of “meeting” beyond receiving an improved rating?**
- (b) The highest number of services who fall into the “working towards” rating are for-profit providers and independent schools, where respectively 21.3% and 21.6% are working towards meeting the National Quality Standard. How is the Department working with private for profit and independent school providers of early childhood education and care to ensure they meet the National Quality Standard?**

There is no legislated timeframe for a service rated “Working Towards” in Quality Area 2, “Children’s Health and Safety” to be re-rated. There are no current guidelines requiring any service to be rated within a specified period. The proportion of services in NSW rated as ‘Working Towards’ is 18 per cent as at 31 December 2020, down from 26 per cent in December 2019 and significantly down from 44 per cent in 2014.

Services rated as Working Towards are still required to comply with the requirements of the National Law and Regulations which ensure minimum standards for health and safety.

- a) The Department works in partnership with all services to improve quality in a range of ways, including improving public awareness of quality ratings and the benefits of increased participation in quality early childhood education and care for children to influence consumer choice and therefore, further incentivise services to continue to improve quality.
- b) In partnership with the Australian Children’s Education and Care Quality Authority, NSW is delivering a major support program to services rated “Working Towards the National Quality Standard” to boost quality.

The program provides support to long day care, family day care, preschool and outside school hours care services, and includes face-to-face service visits, training, online and telephone support, and resources to support quality improvement.

In early 2019, the Department announced a further initiative to support “Working Towards NQS” rated services to lift quality. Under the Re-Rating Program, services are able to work with the Department’s Quality Support Team, to reflect on and improve their practice, and undertake a self-assessment exercise, prior to reassessment by the Department at no cost to the service.

The Department is committed to providing high quality education and care services and provides a range of sector support, including resources, training and professional development, focussed on improving children’s access to high quality education and care services.

As at 3 March 2021, there were 513 staffing waivers in place for early childhood education and care providers across NSW.

- a) Of the 513 staffing waivers, 507 were in relation to Early Childhood Teachers.
- b) Information is not differentiated by this level of qualification.
- c) The concept of 'regular basis' is not covered within the National Law or Regulations. When applying for a waiver, an approved provider must provide evidence as to why the waiver is needed and for which periods of time within the operating hours of the service the requirements for staffing cannot be met. information is available on the type of waiver that is in place, i.e. whether it is a temporary waiver lasting a maximum of 12 months, or a service waiver which has no expiry date.

- (i) The COVID-19 Free Preschool Funding Program was designed as a top-up payment to community preschool and mobile preschool services to replace a high proportion of fee income. This funding is in addition to funding received through Start Strong for Community Preschools and Mobile Preschool Funding arrangements.

Under 2021 program arrangements:

- Services in lower socioeconomic areas receive 100 per cent of the calculated fee income per term.
- 100 per cent of the calculated fee income is provided for all equity children regardless of the socioeconomic profile of the area (all SEIFA bands).
- For services in higher socioeconomic areas, a minimum of 80 per cent of calculated fee income is provided to services.
- In circumstances in which enrolments have declined over the last year (as per the August 2020 census), services will not receive less funding per term in 2021 than they did per term in 2020.

The Department of Education worked with stakeholders on the development of the COVID-19 Free Preschool Funding Program. The Department will continue to work collaboratively with the sector and monitor program implementation.

- (ii) Community and mobile preschools operate independently of Government and have their own governance arrangements, policies and procedures. This includes setting and managing budgets, setting

fees, enrolments and staffing decisions and determining other operational arrangements.

The Department does not hold ongoing operational data on community preschool budgets.

Randwick Boys High School, Randwick Girls High School and Rose Bay Secondary College each have a school counselling allocation of one full-time five day a week counsellor.

(a) The ratio of counsellor to students for Randwick Boys High School is 1:658.

(b) The ratio of counsellor to students for Randwick Girls High School is 1:936.

(c) The ratio of counsellor to students for Rose Bay Secondary College is 1:1334.

- i. The ratio of counsellors to public high schools in the Coogee electorate is 1:1.

If acute or critical need arises, counsellors will prioritise support for students and colleagues across schools.

- ii. Students are cared for in schools with access to counsellors and a range of other wellbeing school staff and services on a needs basis. School counsellors also work, where indicated, with parents/carers, teachers, learning and support teams, external counsellors, psychologists, medical professionals and other agencies to support student wellbeing and appropriately tailored strategies in schools.

Between 2020 and June 2023, an additional 350 student support officer positions and 100 school counselling positions are being established as part of the NSW Government's \$88.4 million investment to increase students' mental health support.

The additional school counselling positions will be phased in with 25 positions in 2020/21, 50 positions in 2021/22 and 25 positions in 2022/23. The first 25 of the school counselling positions have been recruited.

The Department of Education is also working with NSW Health to deliver on their

commitment to rollout an additional 100 Wellbeing Health In-reach Nurse (WHIN) coordinators over four years, 2021-2025. WHIN coordinators will support vulnerable school students and their families' health and wellbeing needs, and coordinate appropriate assessments and referral to health and social services.

A mental health and wellbeing hub has also been established on the Department's website. This is a single-entry point to resources, information, tools and programs to support the mental health and wellbeing of students, teachers, parents and carers.

Randwick Girls High School and Rose Bay Secondary College will be allocated a full time Student Support Officer in July 2021. Randwick Boys High School will be allocated a full time Student Support Officer in July 2022.
