Subject: Clarification of evidence given at the Inquiry into the *Integrity, efficacy and value for money of NSW Government grant programs.*

I write to advise of clarifications to evidence given by myself at the Public Accountability Committee Inquiry hearing on the *Integrity, efficacy and value for money of NSW Government grant programs* on 26 April 2021.

Clarification of the number of Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund Stage One projects not supported by the Commonwealth

When asked about the Commonwealth "approved and rejected projects" under the Stage One Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund, I affirmed the statement made by Mr Shoebridge that 10 or 11 projects were rejected by the Commonwealth. The statement is recorded on page 49 of the uncorrected transcript.

I would like to clarify that under the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund Stage One early cofunded projects:

- 52 Bushfire Industry Recovery Package Sector Development projects were put forward to the Commonwealth. Two of these projects were not supported by the Commonwealth.
- 38 fast-tracked priority local infrastructure projects were put forward to the Commonwealth. Eight of these projects were not supported by the Commonwealth; five were withdrawn or funded from other sources; and three have not been announced.

In total, 72 Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund Stage One early co-funded projects endorsed by the Commonwealth have been announced. The 72 projects consist of 50 Bushfire Industry Recovery Package – Sector Development projects, and 22 fast-tracked priority local infrastructure projects.

Clarification of the project announced separately to the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund Stage One early co-funding announcement in early November 2020

When asked about the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund stage one early co-funding announcement made in November 2020, I stated that 71 projects were announced at the time, with one project subsequently being announced separately. I stated that I believed the project announced separately was \$3 million for a package of three community halls. The statement is recorded on page 31 of the uncorrected transcript.



The \$3 million for the community halls was announced separately on 13 November 2020 after the initial announcement on 2 November 2020. While the project funding amount and the locations specified during the line of questioning was factually correct, I would like to clarify the community halls was included in the initial 71 projects for \$177 million. The project that was withheld in the initial announcement on 2 November 2020 was the \$2.9 million Tumbarumba Mill Optimisation Project submitted by Hyne Timber under the Bushfire Industry Recovery Programs – Sector Development Grants. Stage One early co-funded projects now total 72 projects for \$180 million.
