1. Could you please provide a breakdown of how many laptops have been issued to students by LGA since the lockdown began?

As at 25 August 2021, over 22,600 computer devices have been provided to schools to support remote teaching and learning. The breakdown by Local Government Area is included in the following table.

3. How many teachers in NSW government schools are currently vaccinated?

The NSW Government has mandated vaccination for all school staff across all three sectors by 8 November, except those with medical exemption.

The Department of Education asked all school-based staff in government preschools and schools to answer a voluntary and anonymous survey about their vaccination status and intentions. The survey was open 20-25 August 2021, and approximately 53,000 (42 per cent of captured staff), responded to the survey. The findings from the survey indicate 67 per cent of respondents have had at least one COVID-19 vaccination.

In July 2021, the Department worked with NSW Health to invite around 17,000 primary and secondary school staff and 2,150 Early Childhood Educators from Fairfield, Liverpool and Canterbury-Bankstown Local Government Areas (LGA) for priority vaccination.

4. How many support staff in NSW government schools are currently vaccinated?

5. Will all on-site school staff and teachers be required to be vaccinated before a school returns to face-to-face learning?

Vaccinations for school staff across all sectors will be mandatory from 8 November 2021.

6. What percentage of NSW HSC students have been working from home since the lockdown initially began in NSW on 25th June?

Approximately 60 per cent of all HSC students enrolled in NSW public schools have been learning from home since 25 June 2021 under restrictions that apply to the Greater Sydney area.

From 16 August 2021, Year 12 and HSC students have been able to attend school on site individually or in small groups for essential curriculum and wellbeing reasons.

7. How many students have dropped out of school since 25 June 2021, broken down by LGA and school year?

A total of 2,222 students from Years 10 to 12 are recorded as having signed out of NSW public schools to leave secondary education since 25 June 2021. This figure includes students who left school to pursue full time work, start a full-time apprenticeship, or commence a TAFE/RTO course.

The Department of Education does not have student data at this level by LGA.

8. Have any schools reported to the Department of Education that some students are not showing up for online learning?

Student attendance and engagement during learning from home is monitored regularly by schools. Where students are absent from sessions or not demonstrating engagement with remote learning activities, this is managed through existing school attendance processes.

9. When will Year 12 students in Dubbo and the surrounding region have access to Pfizer vaccines? Will this be before their HSC exams, and if not, why not?

NSW Health are responsible for the vaccine rollout in NSW. The Minister and the Department of Education continue to advocate for priority vaccination for all students and school staff across NSW.

10. How many HSC students have been vaccinated at Qudos Arena? Please provide a list broken down by LGA.

11. Do you have any records of how many HSC students have been vaccinated at other locations?

Students took 180 Department of Education funded trips to or from the Qudos Bank Arena vaccination centre between 11 and 29 August 2021.

13. How many HSC students with disability have accessed a personalised arrangements to be vaccinated?

The Department of Education is working with Western Sydney Local Health District (WSLHD) to offer vaccinations for eligible students with complex needs, for whom mass vaccination at Qudos Bank Arena was unsuitable. These students will be vaccinated at Blacktown Hospital in early September 2021.

As of 30 August 2021, WSLHD was processing bookings for 117 students from 47 schools. An additional 56 schools indicated their students have been vaccinated through other avenues.

14. How many applications have been made to the COVID-19 special consideration program since the 21 June 2021?

The completion date for students for Society and Culture Personal Interest Projects (PIP) was 9 August 2021.

As at 23 August 2021, 51 schools have submitted COVID-19 Special Consideration applications for 491 students relating to their PIPs.

Other courses for which the COVID-19 Special Consideration applies are not due yet, so numbers are not finalised.

15. How many illness/misadventure applications have been made to NESA since 21 June 2021?

As at 23 August 2021, 39 students have submitted individual illness/misadventure applications for a variety of reasons.

16. How many additional counselling or wellbeing staff has the Department of Education hired during the current lockdown?

Since 26 June 2021, over 157 full-time equivalent (FTE) counselling and wellbeing staff have been hired.

17. What additional online counselling or wellbeing support has been provided during remote learning?

To better support students during learning from home, the Department of Education has provisioned members of the school counselling service with a dedicated online telepsychology platform. This allows remote interaction with students, and where appropriate, parents and carers. This enables psychology services to continue securely and confidentially.

Student Support Officers, School Chaplains, and Wellbeing Nurses contact our students, providing an additional layer of support to that already being provided by the class teachers and school leadership teams.

The Department is also working collaboratively with partners such as NSW Health, headspace, Kids Helpline, the Black Dog Institute, and ReachOut to provide counselling staff with additional resources to further support students during the pandemic, including after-hours requests for support.

The Learning from Home Hub includes age-appropriate daily videoed wellbeing activities for primary students and 20 minute self-directed sessions for and secondary students. These materials have been developed to increase students' sense of wellbeing and resilience.

The Department have also created the Stay Healthy HSC webpage specifically for Year 12 students and their families. These resources include contacts for 24 hour free and confidential support services, tips for studying, specific advice for families and carers and many more support materials to maintain good wellbeing.
