Answer:

I am advised:

- (1) Construction of six Rail Clearways Program projects is complete, with four commissioned and fully operational. Seven other projects are currently underway and will be progressively delivered from early 2009.
- (2) As detailed in the mini budget announcement on 11 November 2008, the Government has carefully re-prioritised a number of current and future rail infrastructure projects to ensure that available resources are directed at projects that will deliver the best results for the community and the best value for money.

As announced, the Richmond Line Duplication Project will be delivered in two stages.

Stage 1 is scheduled for completion in 2011 and includes a new station at Schofields and duplication of the line between Quakers Hill Station and the new Schofields Station.

Stage 2 of the project includes the construction of a second track between the new Schofields Station and Vineyard, an upgrade of Riverstone Station and a new and upgraded Vineyard Station has been deferred and will be delivered in the future to align with growth in the North West. The NSW Government has also determined not to proceed with the Carlingford Line Passing Loop and the Sydenham to Erskineville 6 Track projects.

(3) Since the commencement of the Cronulla Line upgrading and duplication project in 2007, there has been a significant increase in the scope to include a new and fully integrated signalling system. Further scope changes also include an upgraded electrical system, an additional substation at Gymea and reconfiguration of the train stabling yard at Cronulla.

It has also been necessary for RailCorp to re-schedule the possessions on the Illawarra (Main) and the Cronulla (Branch) lines to suit the commissioning program for its Main Line re-signalling and train control upgrading project. The commissioning of the Branch Line is dependent on the commissioning of the re-signalling of the Main Line.

Due to the increases in the scope of the project, re-scheduled possessions, the need for commissioning of the Cronulla branch Line to follow commissioning of resignalling on the Illawarra main Line and critical skills shortages, the Cronulla Line Duplication Project is now scheduled to be delivered in 2010.

Commuters have already begun to benefit from the station upgrades, including new ticketing facilities at Kirrawee Station, with Easy Access facilities at Kirrawee and Woolooware stations to open by mid-2009. Other benefits to station users will include improved pedestrian access, additional security lighting, new seating, more undercover areas and improved visual amenity.

- (4) The Cronulla Line upgrading and duplication project is scheduled for completion in 2010.
- (5) As at November 2008, total TIDC expenditure on the Cronulla Line upgrading and duplication project is approximately \$160 million.
- (6) The Cronulla Line upgrading and duplication project is valued at \$344 million.
