Hospital in the Home

QUESTION 1

How many COVID-19 patients are currently being cared for in the HITH system in the South West Sydney Local Health District?

ANSWER

As at 08:00 on 1 October 2021, a total of 1,740 COVID-19 positive patients were registered to the HITH program or COVID-19 Community Care Team in SWSLHD.

QUESTION 2

Are doctors and/or specialists working in the HITH system are also employed at NSW Public hospital?

ANSWER

All Medical Officers working on the COVID-19 Community Care Medical Team hold substantive positions at hospitals within SWSLHD.

QUESTION 3

Are doctors working in the HITH system allocated a specific area or suburbs to treat patients within their LHD?

ANSWER

Medical assessment is facilitated through video conferencing, where possible, or telephone. This allows the medical team to undertake a medical assessment for any patient across SWSLHD.



QUESTION 4

What allied health workers work in the hospital in the home system?

ANSWER

The designation of Allied Health staff working for the COVID-19 Community Care Team is:

- 20 speech pathologists
- 11 psychologists
- 10 physiotherapists
- nine occupational therapists
- seven dietitians
- one exercise physiologist
- · one allied health assistant.

QUESTION 5

How many allied health workers work in the hospital in the home system?

ANSWER

59 allied health staff are rostered to work for the COVID-19 Community Care Team.

QUESTION 6

How many assistant nurses are currently working in the HITH system?

ANSWER

Zero.

QUESTION 7

What is the average length of time a COVID-19 patient has been under the care of the hospital in the home system?

ANSWER

12.2 days.

QUESTION 8

How many of the 3,700 people under the care of the HITH system have received at least one medical review since 26 June 2021?

ANSWER

From 26 June 2021 to 9 August 2021, medical assessment was provided by the Respiratory Physician on-call. This involved a telephone or video consultation facilitated by the COVID-19 Community Care Team nurse with the Respiratory Physician.

From 10 August 2021 onwards, the COVID-19 Community Care Medical Team has been providing a HITH service for COVID-19 positive patients in home isolation.



Between 10 August 2021 and 29 September 2021, the COVID-19 Community Care Medical Team has completed 1,601 medical assessments.

Not all COVID-19 positive patients require a medical assessment as a part of their journey of care. Of those identified as requiring a medical assessment, 100 per cent have received it.

QUESTION 9

How many COVID-19 patients were under the care of the HITH system in 2020?

ANSWER

A total of 519 COVID-19 positive patients were provided care by the COVID-19 Community Care Team between 25 March 2020 and 30 December 2020.

QUESTION 10

How many patients under the care of the HITH system are in the green category?

ANSWER

As at 08:00 on 29 September 2021, there were 1,485 COVID-19 positive patients identified as low-moderate risk (GREEN).

QUESTION 11

How many patients under the care of the HITH system are in the amber category?

ANSWER

As at 08:00 on 29 September 2021, there were 213 COVID-19 positive patients identified as high risk (AMBER).

QUESTION 12

How many patients under the care of the HITH system are in the red category?

ANSWER

As at 08:00 on 29 September 2021, there were 54 COVID-19 positive patients identified as very high risk (RED).
