Emergency services agencies in the Stronger Communities cluster utilise the NSW Government Legal Services Panel if an external law firm is required to be engaged to obtain advice. Emergency services agencies are required to abide by the Panel rules of engagement, including rules as to costs, reporting and performance management.
