Transport for NSW is also working with Training Services NSW to identify opportunities for training organisations that can expand the training support needed during the transition to Zero Emission Buses.

Further to the announcement from former Minister Rob Stokes in December 2020 that the Freshwater class ferry Narrabeen will be re-engineered and made available for service, what is the current status of this project?

ANSWER: I am advised that the MV Narrabeen engine rebuild has been delayed due to supply chain disruption associated with the COVID-19 pandemic and associated Public Health Orders. Transport for NSW is working with the operator of Sydney Ferries to review the project, given these delays, and ensure the ongoing availability of Freshwater Class vessels.

ANSWER: I am advised that Transport for NSW has been advised by the operator, Transdev Sydney Ferries, that on 22 December 2022, as part of planned drills, while not in service and with no passengers on board, the engines shutdown on the MV Fairlight. The issue with the engine was diagnosed and has since been resolved.

ANSWER: I am advised that the tender for the Vehicular Ferry Operation Services – Sydney Region was released to the market on 21 February 2022 and will close on 28 March 2022.

It is understood the Berowra Ferry was built in 1961, Webb's Creek Ferry in 1959, and Mortlake Ferry in 1960. What plans are in place for vessel renewal for these ferries?

ANSWER: I am advised that two ferries were replaced in the last decade. All maintenance of these ferries, including major Out-of-Water regulatory surveys and renewals are undertaken in accordance with the asset management plans developed in accordance with NSW Treasury Policy TPP 19-07.

Transport for NSW has also prepared an Asset Resilience Strategy, which identifies at a high level the principles and objective of asset resilience, and the need to consider future climate change, as well as non-climate risks and how to adapt our transport assets to the changes.

• Procurement of flood forecasting management tools;

• Pre-extreme event maintenance checks, including checking of gutters and drainage, pumps, and logistical planning for post-event inspections;

• Installation of enhanced lightning and surge protection at vulnerable assets;

• Installation of concrete sleepers as a replacement for timber sleepers, which reduces the likelihood of temperature-induced rail buckling and rail head movement;

• Installation of tension-regulated overhead wiring, which manages the effects of temperature fluctuations to the overhead wiring;

• Enhanced air conditioning of equipment and train cars;

• Improvements to advanced weather warning systems, which provide enhanced communication to key response staff, and improved weather prediction;

• Use of extreme weather speed restrictions for rail networks;

• Incident management and customer management procedures for extreme weather events;

• Condition monitoring of assets subject to extreme weather impacts;

• Development of design standards to provide guidance on existing and future ambient operating conditions of assets;

• Recording of extreme weather and response actions in incident management and asset management systems; and

• Development of corridor bushfire resilience programs.
